# **2021 Legislation Litigation in Lewis and Clark County**

Description of Bill SB 319, Hertz, Campaign Finance laws

<u>Description of Case</u> (DV 21-611) *Forward Montana*, Plaintiffs allege that amendments made in Free Conference Committee violated the single subject of title provision in the Montana Constitution, Article V, Section 11(6).

Judge Mike Menahan

<u>Substitution</u> Yes, initially assigned to Judge McMahon. State filed a motion to substitute, and case was assigned to Judge Seeley. The State filed a second motion to substitute and Judge Menahan assumed jurisdiction.

Summary of Outcome The court permanently enjoined enforcement of Sections 21 and 22 as violative of Article V, Sections 11(1) and (3), of the Montana Constitution, but denied plaintiffs attorney fees.

Appealed to Supreme Court Yes. (2024 MT 75)

<u>Status of Legal Process</u> Supreme Court reversed the District Court on its denial of attorney feed and remanded it to determine appropriate attorney fees.
