## PUBLIC RETIREMENT SYSTEMS

HB 119: Provide funding fo	or public safety pension syste	e <u>ms</u>
Provide OTO appropriations to HPORS (\$27.6M), SRS (\$26.8M), and GWPORS (\$52.8M) so each amortizes in 25 years or less; Increase the GWPORS employer contribution rate to make it the same as the employee contribution rate (9% to 10.56%); Total appropriation of \$107.2M	No amendments; passed House State Admin, passed House 2 <sup>nd</sup> reading, and was tabled in House Appropriations The appropriations and GWPORS employer contribution increase were amended into <u>HB 569</u> ; GWPORS appropriation amount was decreased to \$41.2M; Total appropriation of \$95.6M In addition to the provisions added from HB 119, HB 569 also moves JRS, HPORS, SRS, and GWPORS to an actuarially determined employer contribution rate and a layered amortization model and adds an age requirement to the retirement eligibility criteria for HPORS and SRS	HB 119 was tabled in committee HB 569 was passed by the Legislature and signed by the Governor
SB 18: Add benefit policy s	tatement to pension systems	<u>S</u>
Adds the following policy statement to the start of each defined benefit pension system chapter in the MCA: "It is the policy of the state that additional benefits may not be added to the [PENSION SYSTEM NAME] unless the system amortizes in 30 years or less and the additional benefit is projected to be fully funded in perpetuity"	No amendments; passed by Senate and House	Passed by the Legislature and signed by the Governor



SB 29: Increase and extend the PERS supplemental employer contribution				
Extends the supplemental PERS-DB employer contribution end date from 2024 to 2034 found at 19-3-316, MCA and increases the amount by 0.1% each year (total of 1% increase over 10 years)	No amendments; passed Senate State Admin, Senate Finance & Claims, Senate Floor, House State Admin, House 2 <sup>nd</sup> Reading, and was tabled in House Appropriations A similar provision was amended into <u>HB 226</u> during free conference committee; the amendment set the employer contribution rate for PERS at 9.29% for FY 24 and set it at 9.39% thereafter; HB 226 died in process	SB 29 was tabled in committee HB 226 died in process		
SJ 4: Provide for interim study of PERS and TRS				
Requests an interim study of the public pension systems, building off the 21-22 study, and focusing more specifically on the PERS-DB and TRS systems.	No amendments; passed by Senate and House	Passed by the Legislature and assigned to SAVA by Legislative Council

SB 93: Generally revising ballot issues				
Defines the various types of statewide initiatives; revises submission and processing timelines for statewide initiatives	Amended in Senate State Admin ( <u>SB 93.2</u> ) to add a nonrefundable \$3700 filing fee for a statewide initiative and provide a waiver process for financial hardship, to prohibit the submission of a ballot issue substantially similar to one that failed in the previous 4 years, to add a fiscal note process, to	Passed by the Legislature and signed by the Governor		

revise the AG's legal sufficiency review process, to clarify the interim committee review process, to prohibit electronic signatures on petitions, to clarify the timeline and transmittal process between the SOS and LSD, and to add a severability clause Amended in House State Admin ( <u>SB 93.3</u> ) to clarify the timeline for SOS to transmit to other entities
