

Why is MIC3 & Supporting Military-Connected Children Important

- Montana is home to nearly 3,800 active duty military members in Montana and over 5,700 National Guard and Reserve members.
- Roughly 6500 military-connected students who have at least one parent who
 is serving in Active-Duty, National Guard, or Reserve Status.
 - 2247 children of active-duty service members in Montana.
 - 4224 children of guard and reserve members in Montana.

Montana has military-connected families all over the state, however, the counties with the highest number of military-connected families:

- Cascade County
- Lewis and Clark County
