
Data on reports of missing youth from the Child and Family Services Division.

This information is a sub-set of youth specific to the Office of Child and Family Ombudsman (OCFO). The youth in this report are also included in the overall data of all missing youth in Montana.

MCA 41-3-209 required DPHHS Child and Family Services Division (CFDS) to notify the DOJ Office of Child and Family Ombudsman of any youth who is currently receiving services from CFSD and is also reported missing. Receiving services is a more general category than youth who are in out of home care. Some of these reports involve a youth who is in the care of legal guardians/caregivers and also receiving some support services from CFSD.

The Montana Department of Justice Missing Persons Specialist, Office of Child and Family Ombudsman and Child and Family Services meet monthly to review the reports of missing youth in Montana.

- > Office of Child and Family Ombudsman cross check every youth reported missing statewide with the Child and Family Services databases.
- Youth with a current open status with Child and Family Services are identified and Child and Family Services is notified of those youth.
- Each of the youth is reviewed in the monthly meeting to close any communication gaps between the families, CFSD and law enforcement agencies.
- > The case review typically identifies a number of youths listed as missing who have been located or have returned but are still listed as missing.
- > The Department of Justice Missing Persons Specialist notifies the appropriate law enforcement agency of the youth's location and the local agency removes that name from the active missing list.
- > As of July 30, 2023 there were three (3) youth receiving services from CFSD who remained missing.




January - July 2023 of Youth Reported Missing by CFSD to OCFO:
