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# House Bill 29 (2023) established the Transition Review Committee

to monitor the development of community-based services for individuals who have been or are at risk of being involuntarily committed to the Montana State Hospital and who have a primary diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease, other forms of dementia, or traumatic brain injury. The committee received reports from the Department of Public Health and Human Services at each of its quarterly meetings and heard additional information and public testimony on subjects of concern to the committee. # MEETING SUMMARIES

The following summaries of the committee's quarterly meetings provide a brief overview of the committee's activities and highlight key committee votes. To review a meeting in detail, please see that meeting's audio and video minutes which are available on the committee's website.

## OCTOBER 24, 2023

The committee selected Rep. Jennifer Carlson and Sen. Christopher Pope as its presiding and vice presiding officers, respectively. It adopted its rules and procedures and reviewed its work plan.

It also began its substantive work with updates from the Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS), a presentation on the perspectives of long-term care facilities and their role in patient transition from the Montana State Hospital, and an educational segment on the best practices for treatment and care of individuals with dementia.

## **JANUARY 17, 2024**

Presentations to the committee included a report from DPHHS, an update from long-term care facilities, an overview of state issues and solutions in long-term care, and legal review of civil commitment policy in Montana.

#### MARCH 11, 2024

The committee heard its routine update from DPHHS and senior and long-term care facilities. It also learned about the best practices for treatment and care of individuals with traumatic brain injury and received a statutory review of extension of and discharge from involuntary civil commitment.
