Re: Administrative Rule Review

## Introduction

The Montana Administrative Procedures Act (MAPA) mandates and empowers the Transportation Interim Committee (TIC) to review administrative rules proposed by the Department of Transportation (MDT) and the Motor Vehicles Division (MVD) of the Department of Justice.<sup>1</sup>

TIC's obligation is fulfilled by attorney review of administrative rules proposed by MDT and MVD for procedural compliance with MAPA. Part of that review is to briefly summarize and present proposed rules at TIC meetings.

TIC's review may continue by committee members inquiring into rulemaking. Procedural questions about MAPA and proposed rules may be directed to committee staff. Substantive questions about a particular rule should be directed to MDT or MVD personnel.

TIC does not need to take any action during administrative rule review. Taking no action allows the agency to carry on with the MAPA process. TIC may take actions by a majority vote that affect the MAPA process including:

- Requesting rulemaking records from the agency;<sup>2</sup>
- Requiring the agency to hold a hearing if one hasn't been scheduled already;<sup>3</sup> and
- Objecting to a rule which can delay implementation of the rule for further review by TIC or by the full legislature.<sup>4</sup>
