The Commission's proposed map's proposed HD62 traverses four counties, from Seeley Lake in Missoula County, Powell County, through Lewis and Clark County into Bernice/Basin in Jefferson County. It's not clear from the on-line maps if any Lewis and Clark County residential addresses are included in the new district's formation. One-way travel through this proposed district would entail about 2.5 hours of travel time. A House District Representative would be required to travel through six other districts in the process. Furthermore, in the event of an elected official's resignation, the replacement appointment process would require coordination between four county commissions. I'm currently involved in this process for SD40 with two commissions in play, and know this is a labor intensive and cumbersome process. I am not in favor of this proposal.

By doing that, the residents of Montana City are not kept together – the residents in West Montana City are in HD68 and the residents of East Montana City are in HD61.

In looking at Dave's Redistricting, when adding in the city layers, it incorrectly identifies the municipality of Montana City and cannot be relied upon to represent the idea that Map HDP8 keeps the municipality of Montana City together.

I have been looking at the redistricting "Tentative Commission Proposal #1" map and I have to voice my opposition to this proposal.

The proposed layout for HD047 and HD048 are extreme in their layouts, encompassing portions of completely different communities that would have few shared concerns for their prospective representatives to properly represent. I'd even go so far as to say they look gerrymandered.

In the case of HD048 I find it hard to believe that the citizens of the "River Rock" community near Belgrade would have many shared concerns with the north 19th street community in Bozeman. Similarly HD047 splits up half of the core of Bozeman's residential community with nearly all of Belgrade. Those are two different communities, different concerns, and crucially nearly opposite historical voting patterns which I believe showcases what is really going on with this proposal.

In sum, I am opposed to Proposal 1.

Honorable Members of the Redistricting Committee,

First, thank you for your time and commitment to this important and necessary process. Admittedly, I'm like most Montanans and haven't paid as much attention as I should have earlier in the process. However, with the <u>recently proposed legislative redistricting recommendation</u>, I have some feedback regarding my own district and situation that I feel must be shared.

My wife and I live in Billings, work in Billings, have a business in Billings, pay taxes to the City of Billings, and live in a neighborhood where everyone's connections are to the city, not the adjacent county. There is little to no reason why my city neighborhood should be gerrymandered into the proposed HD 24. I do not live in Bighorn County, nor do I share any connection with it.

Honestly, I can't figure out how a district which reaches to within a mile of the downtown urban core of Montana's largest city, while extending to the Wyoming border, has been judged to fit the <u>Criteria and Goals of State Legislative</u> <u>Districts</u>.

Criteria #3: "Each district shall consist of compact territory. (Article 5, Section 14 of the Montana Constitution). The Commission shall consider the district's functional compactness in terms of travel and transportation, communication, and geography."

The proposed boundaries for HD 24 are in clear violation of this criteria. Stretching from downtown Billings to the Wyoming border is the opposite of compact. Learning more about redistricting, I'm aware of the concepts of "cracking" and "packing," intended to disingenuously draw boundaries that have predetermined outcomes. I cannot interpret this proposed district as anything other than a textbook example of cracking, removing urban interests from the city into a rural dominated area.

Goal #2: "The commission shall attempt to minimize dividing cities, towns, counties and federal reservations when possible."

These proposed district boundaries for HD24 clearly don't meet the second goal. This proposal does a good job of dividing Billings residents OUT of a Billings district and into a vastly rural district.

Goal #3: "Keeping communities of interest intact. The Commission may consider keeping communities of interest intact. 



My name is Nancy Frank. I am a resident of Montana City in Jefferson County.

Proposed Map HDP8 map (Map HDP8) violates the rules because it splits a municipality, separates communities of interest, and violates the rule of compactness and contiguous. It is bad for the residents of Jefferson County.

1. Map HDP8 splits the municipality of Montana City in half. The residents of Montana City are in a small rural community which encompasses both the West and East side of the Interstate. Map HDP8 puts most of Jefferson County in HD61 and then takes the West Half of Montana City and puts it in HD68. By doing that, the residents of Montana City are not kept together – the residents in West Montana City are in HD68 and the residents of East Montana City are in HD61.

In looking at Dave's Redistricting, when adding in the city layers, it incorrectly identifies the municipality of Montana City and cannot be relied upon to represent the idea that Map HDP8 keeps the municipality of Montana City together.

- 2. Map HDP8 separates communities of interest in Montana City. The residents of the West half of Montana City are separated from the residents in the East Half of Montana City when Montana City is split into two districts. Map HDP8 puts the West Half of Montana City in the same HD as West Helena and North Helena in Lewis & Clark County. This violates the rule of keeping communities of interest together.
- 3. Map HDP8 separates the communities of Basin and Bernice from Boulder. Map HDP8 puts Basin and Bernice in HD62 which extends all the way from Bernice and Basin in Jefferson County to Seeley Lake in Missoula County! Basin, Bernice and Boulder are small rural municipalities within 10 minutes of each other. The drive from Bernice to Seeley Lake is 2-1/2 hours! This makes no sense!
- 4. Map HDP8 violates the rule of compactness and contiguous. The Representative from HD62 (formerly HD80) would represent residents of 4 counties (whereas currently represents 2 counties) by adding in small pieces of Jefferson and Missoula Counties. The Representative of HD62 would have to drive through six (6) other districts! to serve the communities of West Montana City, Basin and Bernice. The towns of Bernice and Seeley Lake are separated by 147 miles on the fastest route!

Map HDP8 disenfranchises the residents of Jefferson County by cutting the county into three districts, splitting the municipality of Montana City, separating communities of interest throughout Jefferson County, and connecting communities that are great distances apart in interests, mileage and driving time. Map HDP8 must be revised to rectify the problems created for Jefferson County.

Just because a farmer may visit Walmart in Bozeman doesn't mean their votes for legislative representation should be diluted by city voters. The area North of Belgrade is horribly drawn where all the rural folks out Springhill Rd will have their votes diluted by folks near the Bozeman library.

Belgrade is again lumped into Bozeman. Doesn't Bozeman have enough population to draw districts from itself? Why does it need population in Belgrade????

Commissioner Smith, I know that commissioner Stusek and Essman have been working closely with you on trying to create a fair map, I know they have made a lot of concessions, even to the extent of upsetting many in their own party. If you throw their negotiations and work to compromise into the trash, you leave them with little faith and really no incentive to work further to drawing a consensus map.

Placing Belgrade into its own district/s is certainly achievable. Lumping rural Belgrade in with City Belgrade is also very achievable. If Commissioners Miller and Juneau insist on combining rural and city voters then it would be more logical to combine rural and city that have the same Belgrade zipcode and where their children all attend school.

Lastly, I brought this to the commission's attention during an earlier public hearing. Commissioner Miller even questioned me back on it and then said that they will be taking what I said into consideration later on. Well, it is now currently "later on" and this has not been addressed.

The lines in Map #8, exactly the same as earlier Democrat maps, have been carefully crafted to create only ONE solid Republican district fully within the borders of Gallatin County. On the contrary, they have been crafted to include 8 solid Democrat districts fully within the borders of Gallatin County. Based on the living addresses of current Republican legislators, these carefully crafted lines exclude Republican legislators from running in 66% of the red leaning districts in Gallatin just because they would not live within the borders of the district that crosses county lines.

The law says you are not to unduly favor one party over another. By giving Democrat incumbents at least 8 seats within the county borders and Republican incumbents only 1 you are heavily favoring Democrats over Republicans.

These lines can easily be adjusted to allow Republicans to run in the other 66% of red leaning districts. If you believe in not favoring one party over another by carefully boundary crafting their representation out of office, then adjusting these lines would be extremely easy. Additionally, because of the way Districts 55 and 54 are drawn, Gallatin County would have a hard time recruiting even new candidates in these districts because Gallatin County is not given much population in them.

The boundaries of proposed District 42 need to be left out of the city of Bozeman.

Commission, you came up with a congressional map that avoids litigation. I fully believe you can come forward with a legislative map that also avoids litigation. Map #8 does not do this. I am already hearing talks of lawsuits. Please work on this map extensively or adopt another that fits the mandatory criteria more closely including for Gallatin County.

Regarding the mandatory criteria for legislative districts:

Map CP-1 does a good job at meeting the requirements of protection of minority rights and being contiguous, and does a better job in population equality than HDP-7.

It also does a much better job of keeping districts compact. Looking at the maps I find it difficult to assess compactness of districts, but the Dave's Redistricting tool indicates map CP-1's districts are substantially more compact.

My name is Carol Price. I am a resident of Montana City in Jefferson County.

Proposed Map HDP8 map (Map HDP8) violates the rules because it splits a municipality, separates communities of interest, and violates the rule of compactness and contiguous. It is bad for the residents of Jefferson County.

1. **Map HDP8 splits the municipality of Montana City in half.** The residents of Montana City are in a small rural community which encompasses both the West and East side of the Interstate. Map HDP8 puts most of Jefferson County in HD61 and then takes the West Half of Montana City and puts it in HD68. By doing that, the residents of Montana City are not kept together – the residents in West Montana City are in HD68 and the residents of East Montana City are in HD61.

In looking at Dave's Redistricting, when adding in the city layers, it incorrectly identifies the municipality of Montana City and cannot be relied upon to represent the idea that Map HDP8 keeps the municipality of Montana City together.

- 2. **Map HDP8 separates communities of interest in Montana City.** The residents of the West half of Montana City are separated from the residents in the East Half of Montana City when Montana City is split into two districts. Map HDP8 puts the West Half of Montana City in the same HD as West Helena and North Helena in Lewis & Clark County. This violates the rule of keeping communities of interest together.
- 3. **Map HDP8** separates the communities of Basin and Bernice from Boulder. Map HDP8 puts Basin and Bernice in HD62 which extends all the way from Bernice and Basin in Jefferson County to Seeley Lake in Missoula County! Basin, Bernice and Boulder are small rural municipalities within 10 minutes of each other. The drive from Bernice to Seeley Lake is 2-1/2 hours! This makes no sense!
- 4. **Map HDP8 violates the rule of compactness and contiguous.** The Representative from HD62 (formerly HD80) would represent residents of 4 counties (whereas currently represents 2 counties) by adding in small pieces of Jefferson and Missoula Counties. The Representative of HD62 would have to drive through **six (6) other districts!** to serve the communities of West Montana City, Basin and Bernice. The towns of Bernice and Seeley Lake are separated by 147 miles on the fastest route!

Map HDP8 disenfranchises the residents of Jefferson County by cutting the county into three districts, splitting the municipality of Montana City, separating communities of interest throughout Jefferson County, and connecting communities that are great distances apart in interests, mileage and driving time. Map HDP8 must be revised to rectify the problems created for Jefferson County.

My name is Pamela Raney. I am a resident of Montana City in Jefferson County. (My mailing address is Clancy, MT.)

Proposed Map HDP8 map violates redistricting rules in three different ways (listed below). It is bad for the residents of Jefferson County.

1. **Incorrectly splits the municipality of Montana City in half.** Montana City is a small rural community that encompasses both sides (east and west) of I-15. Map HDP8 would split residents of Montana City between HD061 and HD068. Thus, a homogenous community is divided.

Using city layering functionality on Dave's Redistricting mapping website, HDP8 incorrectly identifies the municipality of Montana City, making it (HDP8) unreliable in terms of keeping communities together.

- 2. **Fractures Montana City's existing identity as a community of interest.** Map HDP8 puts western Montana City in the same HD as West and North Helena in Lewis & Clark County. This violates the rule of keeping communities of interest together.
- 3. **Separates the communities of Basin and Bernice from Boulder.** Map HDP8 also puts Basin and Bernice in HD62, extending from those communities in Jefferson County all the way to Seeley Lake in Missoula County. Basin, Bernice and Boulder are small rural municipalities within 10 minutes driving time of each other. The drive from Bernice to Seeley Lake is 2-1/2 hours. This is, once again, a violation of the communities of interest rule.
- 4. **Violates the rules of compactness and contiguousness.** The Representative from HD62 (formerly HD80) would represent residents of 4 counties (currently 2 counties) by adding in small pieces of Jefferson and Missoula Counties. Under HDP8, the Representative of HD62 (formerly HD80) would have to drive through **6 districts** to serve the communities of West Montana City, Basin and Bernice. 147 miles separate Bernice and Seeley Lake on the fastest route.

Map HDP8 disenfranchises the residents of Jefferson County. How? By...

- Cutting the county into three districts
- Splitting the municipality of Montana City
- Separating communities of interest
- Purporting to fairly serve disparate areas that are in truth separated by significant physical distance and divergent community interests.

Map HDP8 must be revised for the above reasons.

I've lived in Helena's Valley my entire life. I grew up in a trailer park off of Forestville road, and later in a little exurb just north of Bobs Valley Market. Until recently, I had never lived inside city limits, but I have always considered myself strongly Helenan and felt deeply connected to my hometown. The truth is that Helena and the Helena valley are the same community. We all identify as being "from Helena". Dividing Helena and the Valley from one another would be a grave mistake. Splitting Helena's Valley from Helena proper would cause irreparable harm to our community, and only serve to further the divide Montana as a whole is experiencing. Please, keep our community intact. I would like to express my opposition to the proposed HDP 8 that is currently under consideration, in particular HD 55 and 44 based on the goals established as outlined below.

### **Goals for State Legislative Districts**

- No plan may be drawn to unduly favor a political party. It readily apparent that the proposed HD 44 favors a Democrat leaning district, by including part of Madison County that includes the Big Sky developments.
- The commission shall attempt to minimize dividing cities, towns, counties, and federal reservations when possible. The proposed HD 55 divides Madison County that includes a significant part of the Big Sky development. Removal of this part of Madison out of HD 55, requires the expansion of the district into the Gallatin County and the city of Three Forks. These areas should be in a district that has demographics in-line with other Gallatin valley districts. As proposed the mandatary criteria of 'each district consist of compact territory' is ignored. This proposal does the opposite.
- Keeping communities of interest intact. The Commission may consider keeping communities of interest intact. Communities of interest can be based on Indian reservations; urban interests, suburban interests, rural interests, including elementary and high school districts; tribal interests; neighborhoods; trade areas; geographic location; demographics; communication and transportation networks; social, cultural, historic, and economic interests and connections; or occupations and lifestyles. The proposed HD 55 splits off the Big Sky area of Madison County. It also splits the Ennis School District as well as the Madison Valley Hospital District. Madison County is home to many of the employees and service providers that support Big Sky businesses and homeowners. Furthermore, Madison County has recently upgraded the county road that connects and enhances travel and trade with Big Sky and the county. Big Sky is not an incorporated, thus Madison County is the main local government entity that provides those services. Big Sky residences should be represented in the State Legislature by a Representative and Senator that also works with Madison County government as historically been the case.
- The commission may consider competitiveness of districts when drawing plans. The key word is 'may'. The above factors should not outweigh this goal. Constituents' commonality and geographic location should be a higher priority.

In summary, HD 55 should keep Madison County intact, and not be split to enhance a political party. Districts should be created that allow for their elected representative to be their voices in state government without prejudice as established by mandatory criteria and goals established by the Montana Constitution and goals established by the Montana Districting and Apportionment Commission. As proposed residences of Madison County are disenfranchised.

As the commission moves through the redistricting process, please keep in mind that the Senate District should include the proposed House Districts 56 & 55 (as modified) which have similar demographics.

Map HDP 8 is fair and the senate and house Districts fairly match the partisan populations, so all Montanans are represented.
