I am a Montana citizen who strongly opposes maps CP10 and CP12.

Let me remind you that in July, the Redistricting Commission adopted the central goals for the Congressional mapping process. Those goals included not favoring either political party and promoting competitiveness. These goals were adopted by all commissioners and, according to the public record, the general public.

I respectfully, but forcefully request that the Commission follow its own established criteria by adopting a map with at least one competitive district that doesn't unduly favor either political party.

CP10 and CP12 abandon the established criteria and goals. Both CP 10 and CP 12 have Cook PVI scores outside of the range of competitiveness.

Furthermore, I wish to express my frustration that CP12, a last-minute proposal, is even being considered as a "compromise." CP12 is not competitive; divides the communities of Butte from Jefferson County and Helena, despite their shared cultural, economic, and historical identities; rips Livingston away from Gallatin County despite sharing the same regional economy; and denies rural voters a voice.

For example, Helena's most stalwart employment sectors are wholesale trade, healthcare, information, finance, insurance, and real estate; whereas eastern plains communities have seen a substantial drop off in jobs in areas such as health care and government. The city of Helena also has some of the highest post-secondary higher education levels of any area of the state. Many of those people attended UM or MSU—both of which are in the western districts of the remaining maps. Commissioners:

First, I wanted to thank you for your time and service on this project. This is no small feat, and you have the responsibility of making a difficult decision. For that reason, I am writing to you to ask you to reject CP 12, and adopt CP 11 as the tentative final congressional map for Montana.

As a Helena resident, retired member of IUOE 400 and elected union leader, I can tell you that it makes little sense to throw communities like Helena and Boulder into an eastern district, when Butte and Deer Lodge remain in the west. Butte Silver Bow, Deer Lodge, Lewis and Clark and Jefferson Counties represent a distinct economic region with similar industries and a shared workforce. Other maps considered by this commission (and adopted by previous commissions) honored the shared history and community interests Lewis and Clark and Jefferson Counties share with Butte Silver Bow and Deer Lodge Counties. Map 12 does not honor this precedent.

I understand the desire to keep counties intact to the greatest extent possible, but that should not be done by ignoring the strong community interests that bind neighboring counties together. It makes no sense for working folks in Jefferson County to have one representative where they live, and another representative for where they work in Butte. I haven't heard a reason for splitting these counties, but as a union member, I do know that this map will only serve to divide working families who reside in this distinct economic region into two districts. If the commission makes the decision to adopt CP12, they do so knowing that they are intentionally weakening the voice of working people as a constituency group.

Public service is not an easy job, and this Commission is going to have to make a tough decision. If there isn't a good reason behind the line being drawn, it's not the right map for Montana.

Dear Commissioners -

Thank you for all your hard work aimed at drawing fair Congressional redistricting maps for our state.

I am writing to support Map #11, and to a lesser extent Map #13, in the current 4-map discussion before the Montana Districting and Reapportionment Commission. I primarily support Map #11 because, of the four maps being discussed currently, I believe it is the map that most closely meets all self-identified, unanimously adopted, goals of the Commission:

- **Commission Goal 1:** "No plan may be drawn to unduly favor a political party." Both Map #11 and Map #13 have one Republican-leaning district and one competitive district. Map #10 and Map #12, which I oppose, have two Republican districts. Clearly, Map #10 and Map #12 favor one political party and should therefore both be rejected.
- **Commission Goal 2:** "The commission shall attempt to minimize dividing cities, towns, counties and federal reservations between two districts when possible." I support Map #11 because it does not split the towns of Big Sky and Gallatin Gateway. Map #10, which I oppose, does split these two communities for no clear reason.
- **Commission Goal 3:** "Keeping communities of interest intact. The Commission may consider keeping communities of interest intact. Communities of interest can be based on Indian reservations, urban interests, suburban interests, rural interests, tribal interests, neighborhoods, trade areas, geographic location, demographics, communication and transportation networks, social, cultural, historic, and economic interests and connections, or occupations and lifestyles." There are several reasons I think Map #11 is the best map:
 - 1. As a resident of Helena, I support Map #11 because it keeps Lewis & Clark County in the western Congressional District, which is where most of the population in the county is linked economically. As an example, Missoula and Helena share physicians at their hospitals, with some specialists from Missoula working in Helena during each month. In addition, Bozeman, Missoula, and Helena all share the same climate change goals of becoming carbon neutral by 2030. Although sharing this goal may not seem important in some circles, it indicates the individuals in these 3 communities share urban interests/suburban interests, similar visions for transportation, and much more, increasing the reasons they should all be located in the same district. I also believe Jefferson County should remain with Lewis & Clark County and Silver Bow County, because many individuals who live in Jefferson County work and are otherwise economically tied to Helena or Butte. I believe that separating Lewis & Clark County, Jefferson County, and Silver Bow Counties could harm the interdependence of these three areas.
 - 2. Map #11 puts Livingston and Bozeman together, which are two communities that also are deeply connected by individuals who work and are otherwise economically tied together. Map #12 separates these two closely tied communities.

3. Map #11 keeps all of the Rocky Mountain Front, Golden Triangle, and HiLine in-tact, which will serve agriculture well. None of the other maps keep this area in-tact.

Commission Goal 4: "The commission may consider competitiveness of districts when drawing plans." As stated under Commission Goal #1 above, Maps #11 and #13 have one Republican-leaning district and one competitive district. This competitiveness will serve Montana well because whomever represents that district will be required to listen to both sides of any issue in order to make sure they are representing their constituents. Map #10 and #12, which I oppose, have two Republican districts. Clearly, Map #10 and Map #12 favor one political party.

I respectfully, but forcefully request that the Commission follow its own established criteria by adopting a map with at least one competitive district that doesn't unduly favor either political party.

CP10 and CP12 abandon the established criteria and goals. Both CP 10 and CP 12 have Cook PVI scores outside of the range of competitiveness.

Furthermore, I wish to express my frustration that CP12, a last-minute proposal, is even being considered as a "compromise." CP12 is not competitive; divides the communities of Butte from Jefferson County and Helena, despite their shared cultural, economic, and historical identities; rips Livingston away from Gallatin County despite sharing the same regional economy; and denies rural voters a voice.

A final reason to reject CP12 is because of its unabashed targeting of working people and their unions. CP12 splits workers who have banded together for better working conditions, wages, and benefits.

In Montana, we honor our commitments. Please honor your commitments by rejecting CP10 and CP12 for violating the criteria you established and dividing linked communities, and silencing both rural and union voters

Commissioners,

My name is Erin Foley, and I proudly serve as the Secretary-Treasurer for Teamsters Local 2 and as the President of the Montana AFL-CIO.

The Montana AFL-CIO is a federation of 38 unions and 500 locals that directly represent over 50,000 working Montanans as well as the interests of working families across the state. It is our belief that all working people deserve good jobs and the power to determine their wages and working conditions. And just as unions serve as democratic bodies, we believe firmly in the right and power of working people to have an active voice in our elections and to ensure that elected officials are responsive to the needs of working people, their families, and their communities.

As a lifelong resident of Butte and a long-time union member, I am writing to oppose Proposals 10 and 12. These maps divide working families living in Lewis and Clark, Jefferson, Butte Silver Bow and Deer Lodge Counties into two districts. This Commission has identified a goal to keep communities of interest intact. As representatives of workers living in these areas, we contend that the communities of Butte Silver Bow, Jefferson, Deer Lodge, and Lewis and Clark Counties represent a unique economic region, with a shared workforce and strong community ties. In fact, many residents of these communities live in one county, and work in another, and under Proposals 10 and 12 would have one representative for where they live, and another for where they work. We believe that shared economies like those represented in this area of the state are a community of interest that should be honored in this Commission's congressional map.

In listening to the Commission's deliberations, I heard an expressed interest in preserving, to the best extent possible, the historic divide of our previous Congressional map. I have not heard a rationale given for why Jefferson and Lewis and Clark Counties are suddenly thrown into the Eastern District, when they were not in previous proposals considered by this Commission. And I would ask the Commission to only consider these changes when they are necessary to and clearly meet the Commission's goals.

We continue to voice our support for Proposal 11 which best meets this Commission's stated criteria and which will keep intact the families living and working in the communities of Helena, Boulder, Butte, Deer Lodge, and Anaconda in a district that does not unduly favor one political party. This will ensure that those running to serve us in Congress can only do so with the support of working Montanans.

They have little in common with Eastern Montana.
- 2. Unions form communities of interest, too. Keeping Helena in the same district as Butte, Anaconda, and Deer Lodge gives the those unions a voice. They form a community of interest that is very important to economy of Montana.
- 3. Finally, minority rights are an important part of a healthy democracy. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on proposals for Montana's new congressional district.

In brief, I strenuously OPPOSE CP 12. I support CP 11 or CP 13, with a preference for CP 11.

CP 12 has numerous fatal flaws, but the worst is that it puts Lewis & Clark County in the Eastern District.

I'm a lifetime Lewis & Clark County resident. I grew up in Helena. So did both of my parents. So did 10 of my nieces and nephews, and many of them are now raising their kids here. Dear Members of the Redistricting Commission:

We are beginning to feel and sound like a broken record. We keep saying the same thing because what we are saying is not being heard: it is unethical to create two districts in Montana that favor the same party. Furthermore, it is one of your own goals to create competitive districts. By way of reminder, in July 2021 the Commission voted unanimously in favor of the proposition that the Commission "may consider competitiveness of districts when drawing plans." This is the Commission's language, not the language of a single political party. We are writing to urge you to stick with your stated goal about competitiveness and be certain that the map you select comports with your duty to act as body that is independent of the legislature. Failure to abide by your own goals, effectively undercuts your constitutional mandate to act as an independent body. In other words, do not be intimidated by threats of lawsuits coming from the legislative branch.

After weighing in on maps 1 through 9 and then on maps 10 and 11, we weigh in yet again. This time on maps 12 and 13.

Please remember that the Commission represents the voices of all Montanans not just the voice of one party and that to abide by one of its own goals, the commission should try to create competitive districts or at the very least, one competitive district. (Please do not be distracted by one party's references to HB 506 which is likely to be overturned as unconstitutional per a 1973 attorney general's decision which states that the legislature is not allowed to interfere with the commission's work on drawing district boundaries.) As we have said twice before, competition is essential for giving Montanans a sense that their vote matters, that they should inform themselves about the issues facing their state and weigh in by supporting a candidate that is attentive to their needs. Competitive districts mean that candidates need to moderate their extreme views by appealing to people from both sides of the aisle because listening to the voice of just one side won't give them a majority of votes. Without competitive districts, more and more Montanans will turn away from politics and no longer make any effort to solve the problems facing their state. They will withdraw into a world of fantasy and entertainment because they know their representative does not need to listen to their perspective or care what they might have to say because their votes do not matter. The representative has his/her election all sewed up...it's a done deal before it's even begun.

This is the only opportunity we will have for a long time to draw congressional districts that encourage all Montanans to participate in the governing of their state. Please, please do the right thing: do what you can to create competitive districts (or at least one!). Map 12 does not

do this: it outlines two districts that favor the same party. We urge you to go for map 11 or 13. Both recognize that competition is possible in at least one district.

If you don't like map 11, here are some good reasons to go for map 13 over map 12;

- In map 13, both districts would have at least two reservations;
- In map 13, at least one district is competitive (in map 12, this is not the case).

Similarly Butte and Jefferson counties would be in different districts, although their populations link closely for employment & housing opportunities.

Overall, the proposed district structure of CP 12 is utterly uncompetitive — essentially advanced gerrymandering — and should not be adopted.
