With the flurry of finalizing on a Congressional District map, trying to keep pace of and understand where District lines are, this process has been challenging. I am in support of the newly established proposal # 13. Following is my rationale; please observe the criteria, standards and goals established by the Commission through Constitutional law, National Voting Rights Act and public input at the beginning of this important process.

- 1- It is population equal.

Statement of Jacqueline De León Staff Attorney for the Native American Rights Fund to the Montana Districting and Apportionment Commission November 4, 2020

My name is Jacqueline De León, and I am a Staff Attorney with the Native American Rights Fund ("NARF"), a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization that focuses on applying existing laws and treaties to guarantee that national and state governments live up to their legal obligations to tribes. NARF is headquartered in Boulder, Colorado, but we have worked with Montana's tribes to protect their rights many times over the years. This year, we are following the legislative and congressional redistricting processes in Montana, on behalf of several tribes. Thank you for the opportunity to provide comment.

As the Commission evaluates its final maps, Maps 10, 11, 12, and 13, we offer our analysis of these remaining maps under this Commission's mandatory criteria and goals. Our priority has always been for the Commission to adopt a map that includes the most number of Tribes in a competitive district. We believe that this will result in the best representation for Native American communities in Montana because it will require politicians to be responsive to Native priorities and issues.

As an initial step, we evaluated the maps based on their competitiveness. Our understanding is there is no question that Map 10 is in fact not competitive and therefore does not meet this Commission's goals. For the remaining maps, we engaged an independent expert to evaluate the competitiveness of Maps 11, 12, and 13. I have submitted that expert report to this Commission. Upon review, our expert concluded that Maps 11 and 13 are lean Republican but ultimately competitive. Our expert found that Map 12 was not competitive except in exceptional instances. Because these exceptional circumstances are so rare – across all 16 contests analyzed, Republicans won 13 contests – our conclusion is that Map 12 is not in fact competitive under this Commission's goals.

Map 12 was compelling to us because it included two tribal nations, the Blackfeet Nation and the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes (CSKT), in what was presented as a competitive district. For this reason, we engaged an independent expert to evaluate the maps' competitiveness to determine whether we could support Map 12. The results of our independent expert's analysis lead us to determine that Map 12 is not in fact competitive. Thus, we cannot recommend its adoption.

Out of the two remaining maps, Maps 11 and 13, we believe Map 13 is the better choice. Map 13 keeps two tribal nations, the Blackfeet Nation and CSKT, together in a single, competitive

district and respects the Blackfeet's express desire to be placed with the rest of Western Montana. Map 13 has been endorsed by both Blackfeet and CSKT.

Map 13 has been criticized because it splits three counties, Gallatin, Lewis and Clark, and Pondera, between the two districts, whereas Maps 11 and 12 split only one county, Pondera. This concern is unfounded, as Map 13 is legally sound and, on balance when compared with the remaining maps, best satisfied the Commission's mandatory criteria and goals. Rejecting Map 13 simply because it splits three counties, as opposed to one county, elevates one of the Commission's goals – respecting existing political boundaries – above the rest of the Commission's mandatory criteria and goals. The Commission adopted a number of goals to consider in drawing the district boundaries, in addition to its mandatory criteria, including minimizing splitting cities, counties, towns, and reservation between districts; keeping communities of interest intact; and competitiveness. In drawing district boundaries, the Commission must give equal weight to all these goals.

The boundaries that split the three counties are not arbitrarily drawn; they reflect careful consideration of both the Commission's mandatory criteria and goals and deliver a map that will provide the best representation for the State. On balance, Map 13 best meets the Commission's mandatory criteria and goals: it is compact and contiguous; of the four remaining maps, it give the greatest protection of minority (i.e., Native Americas) voting rights by including the maximum number of reservations in the most competitive map; it keeps together communities of interest (i.e., the Flathead Reservation and the Blackfeet Reservation); it is the most competitive map being considered by the Commission and gives no party an unduly favorable advantage; and it only splits three of Montana's fifty-six counties.

Being split between multiple counties is a daily reality for every single one of the Montana's reservation-based tribes. At a minimum, each reservation is split between two counties, and in two instances, between four counties. The Blackfeet Indian Reservation is split between two counties: Glacier and Pondera; the Crow Indian Reservation is split between two counties: Big Horn and Yellowstone; the Fort Belknap Indian Reservation is split between two counties: Blaine and Phillips; the Northern Cheyenne Indian Reservation is split between two counties: Big Horn and Rosebud; and the Rocky Boy's Indian Reservation is split between two counties: Chouteau and Hill. Most egregiously, the Fort Peck Indian Reservation is split between four counties: Daniels, Roosevelt, Sheridan, and Valley; and the Flathead Indian Reservation is slip between four counties: Flathead, Lake, Missoula, and Sanders.

These splits have real-world, daily implications for tribal members living on these reservation, because reservations, as cohesive political entities, are split between various county-level units of local government, ensuring an overall lack of political representation in local matters and a lack of access to local governmental services. In contrast, the impact of Map 13's splits in Gallatin, Lewis and Clark, and Pondera Counties are minimal. Blackfeet has expressed that it favors the split along the reservation boundary with Pondera. And upon review of public comment it appears that the splits in Gallatin and Lewis and Clark keep likeminded communities intact.

Therefore, we recommend that Map 13 be adopted by this Commission. Map 11 also meets this Commission's criteria.

Finally, I apologize for the lateness of the submission – we were awaiting the independent analysis of our expert before preparing comment and he completed that analysis today.

Thank you for consideration of our comments.

Dear Montana's Independent Redistricting Commission:

We call on the Commission to adopt Map CP 13 for Montana's two congressional districts. The Blackfeet Nation endorses this map for three reasons. First, Blackfeet have strong ties with the Confederated Salish & Kootenai Tribes (CSKT) and to Western Montana and we would like to be included in a Congressional district with them. Second, we believe a competitive district would best serve Blackfeet's interests. Finally, we believe that the competitive district should include the most Native American communities as possible.

A competitive district means that politicians need to engage with us in order to secure our vote. This leads to a healthier democracy and more favorable outcomes for our people. We believe a competitive district would mean more engagement, which means that the issues that matter to our community are more likely to be addressed. For us, it is essential to us that there be a competitive district in Montana. The competitive district should also include as many Tribal Nations as possible. As the largest minority community in Montana, we believe that inclusion of as many Native American communities in a competitive district as possible best serves Native Americans in the state of Montana because it will lead to Native issues being elevated across the state instead of just one Native community.

We urge the Commission to adopt Map CP 13. It includes the most number of Tribal Nations, both the Blackfeet Nation and CSKT, in the most competitive district. The splitting of Pondera County along the reservation boundary is acceptable to us. We believe that Map CP 13 best serves Native Americans in the state of Montana and best fulfills the Commission's mandatory criteria and goals.

The Blackfeet Nation is strongly opposed to Maps CP 10 and 12 because they are not competitive and will disenfranchise the political voices of our people. We have reviewed the independent analysis of the expert provided by the Native American Rights Fund and do not believe Map CP 12 is competitive enough to actually incentivize politicians to engage with us and therefore do not believe it meets the competitive criteria.

We would support the Commission adopting Map CP 11 as a second choice because it includes at least one Tribal Nation, CSKT, in a competitive map, but Map CP 13 is our strong preference.

We believe that although Map CP 13 splits multiple counties it does so in a logical and fair way. Importantly, Map CP 13 also meets other criteria of keeping communities of interest – the CSKT and Blackfeet Nation – together. As we have stated, we would like to be with Western Montana.

We urge the Commission adopt Map CP 13. Thank you for your consideration.


This memorandum presents the results of a performance analysis of three proposed Congressional District (CD) maps in Montana: 11, 12, and 13. I focus the analysis specifically on Montana's proposed District 1 because this is the map designed to be politically competitive. First, I briefly discuss my methodology, second, I present the results for each map.


To conduct the analysis, for each proposed map, I assign voting districts (precincts) to either District 1 or District 2 based on the new CD boundaries. Because demographers use blocks as the base layer to draw CD maps, sometimes precincts get split between District lines. For example, of the 312 precincts falling into Map 11, District 1, just six precincts are split across district boundaries. For example, Map 11 splits Precinct 7 in Flathead County. In such scenarios I do a visual inspection of the precinct boundary as well as relying on the precinct centroid location to adjudge where the bulk of the population in the precinct lands to assign the precinct in or out of the district. Next, I examine statewide general contests held in the state between 2016-2020. For example, to assess the 2020 presidential performance, I sum all of Trump's (R) District 1 precinct votes, sum all of Biden's (D), then divide each candidate total by the total number of votes in the new district's boundaries. In Map 11, Trump received 165,329 votes (out of 326,599 cast for president), and Biden 152,866. Thus, Trump won Map 11, District 1, 50.6% - 46.8% for a 3.8% R lean. To assess overall competitiveness per year, I average the total R-D margin across each contest analyzed.

In 2020, for each map, I analyze seven contests: 1) U.S. Senate: Bullock (D) vs. Daines (R); 2) U.S. House of Representatives: Williams (D) vs. Rosendale (R); 3) Secretary of State: Bennett (D) vs. Jacobsen (R); 4) President: Biden (D) vs. Trump (R);


5) Governor: Cooney (D) vs. Gianforte (R); Auditor: Morigeau (D) vs. Downing (R); and Attorney General: Graybill (D) vs. Knudsen (R). Figure 1 presents the results. For Map 11, the Republican candidates win six of seven contests, with an average margin of victory of 2.59%. For Map 12, the Republican candidates win seven of seven contests, with an average margin of victory of 6.11%. For Map 13, the Republican candidates win six of seven contests, with an average margin of victory of 2.8%.

Figure 1. Performance analysis proposed District 1: Maps 11, 12, and 13, 2020 statewide contests






Map 12 Proposed Congressional District 1, MT 2020 Elections




Map 13 Proposed Congressional District 1, MT 2020 Elections




In 2018, for each map, I analyze three contests: 1) U.S. Senate: Tester (D) vs. Rosendale (R); 2) U.S. House of Representatives: Williams (D) vs. Gianforte (R); 3) Clerk of Supreme Court: Renk (D) vs. Greenwood (R). For Map 11, the Democratic candidates win three of three contests, with an average margin of victory of 7.4%. For Map 12, the Democratic candidates with two contests, and the Republican candidate one, with Democrats on average receiving 3.6% more of the vote. For Map 13, the Democratic candidates win three of three contests, with an average margin of victory of 7%.

In 2016, for each map, I analyze six contests: 1) President: Clinton (D) vs. Trump (R); 2) U.S. Representative: Juneau (D) vs. Zinke (R); 3) Governor: Bullock (D) vs. Gianforte (R); 4) Attorney General: Jent (D) vs. Fox (R); 5) Secretary of State: Lindeen (D) vs. Stapleton (R); and 6) Auditor: Laslovich (D) vs. Rosendale (R). For Map 11, the Republican candidates win four of six contests, with an average margin of victory of 4%. For Map 12, the Republican candidates win five of six contests, with an average margin of victory of 7.55%. For Map 13, the Republican candidates win four of six contests, with an average margin of victory of 4.18%.

Conclusion: Maps 11 and 13 are equally competitive, with Map 11 possibly slightly more competitive but either one is very likely to produce nearly an exact same election result. Still, on average, Maps 11 and 13 are more likely to produce Republican victories than Democratic victories outside Democratic-wave years. For both maps, across all elections analyzed, Republicans won 10 contests, and Democrats 6, for an average margin of victory 1.3% (Map 11) and 1.5% (Map 13). In the language of the Cook Report, this would be a lean Republican seat most years but has the potential to move into toss-up.

Although exceptional Democratic candidates can and have won under Map 12 (e.g., Jon Tester), Republican candidates are much more likely to win here and win easily than in Maps 11 and 13. Across all 16 contests analyzed, Republicans win 13 contests, and Democrats just 3, for an average margin of victory at 4.8%. In other words, Map 12 falls outside of the range of competitive outside of extreme circumstances.

Your decision to keep open the Districting Maps public comment period is admirable on one level.; It is the right thing to do democratically, but on another level, it is very confusing to the public because of the very short timeline to garner public reaction to an immensely consequential, decade-long exercise in line-drawing.

From the outside looking in at your efforts, it appears that you're seeking public comment on various plans that have been thrown over the transom at the 11th hour, each of which is yet a new plan by both political parties to gain last minute tipping point advantage in partisan redistricting.

While most citizens can understand and accommodate the need for last minute micro-tuning of public policies before they formally go public, this latest turn in the Commission's once-a-decade mission smacks of chaos and a late hour scramble by both political parties to either gain a smidgeon of added advantage or a smidgeon of defensive protection. Either way, it's pretty pathetic all the way around.

Given the fraught partisan times we live in, there seems to be no escape from hyper partisanship in *every* public purpose we undertake. Since that is the case, and because we are saddled with an entrenched two party system, the *only* choices we citizens are presented with are to favor one party's view over another. That sucks.

It sucks because there's a sizable number of us who had hopes that the Commission could live up to its mission of creating districts that "do not unduly favor one party over another." Kiss that noble goal goodbye if you accept either of the latest submitted proposals. All of them suffer from the problem of "unduly favoring."

Of the proposals we've had a chance to study, I favor Map 11 because it seems to come closest to creating two districts, each with some possibility of either party winning or losing, and neither of which create perpetually Red or Blue districts.

In our constantly recurring efforts for democracy to "form a more Perfect Union", please observe the need to create districts that always offer Purple as a choice over districts that only assure Red or Blue outcomes for the next decade. As a State, we need to keep vibrant debate alive, not submerge it to either party's dominance.

Political winds are in constant flux. Seek districts that invite that flux rather than cement predictable partisan outcomes for the coming decade. Be wise, not perfect.

Honorable Chair Smith and Honorable Commissioners Essman, Lamson, Miller and Stusek,

This is my third time commenting on your work and I hope you are soon able to come to consensus on the Congressional districts for the sake of all Montanans who want to have faith in our ability as a people to do what is best for all, despite the discourtesy, threats and plain rude behavior that characterizes our current political discourse. I trust that you will not encourage or abet this bad behavior and will move toward harmony as you have been encouraged to do by your very capable Chair.

It is very clear that a few counties will have to be somewhat divided to assure population equality. My final choice of the maps available would be CP11 or 12. CP11 divides only one county and it is a very urban county, so if your goal is to keep counties intact as much as possible, that should be your top choice. If your goal is to keep communities of interest intact, then CP13 should be your choice. It divides three counties but keeps two Indian nations in the Western District. By dividing the urban area around Helena, it assures that people living and working in the capitol city and in State government will be attuned to and actively aware of what is going on in both Congressional Districts and, hopefully, engaged in all the issues of importance to Montanans. The political figures from past elections show that the Eastern District in both circumstances is a lock for Republicans, but the Western District in both these maps would be competitive, which is what needs to happen so we can have effective representation of all Montana points of view.

As to the Republican Commissioners claims that they have created "fair" maps, I will repeat what my good Republican mother would have said: Don't try to put the shuck on me. First, I want to tackle CP1, the map that many of the in-person testifiers resurrected at the last hearing. I am still waiting for an explanation from Commissioners Essman and Stusek as to why it is crucial to fairness to split the town of Ulm and other small communities and counties. Sounds more like a bait and switch play to me, so I think we can dismiss that testimony for the political ploy it was. Ah, these businessmen who think they know politics.

The other remaining Republican proposed maps are CP10 and CP12. Both of these maps are somewhat nonsensical because they break Lewis & Clark County away from the West and place extra urban population in Eastern Montana. The advantage had by the rural population and the rural economic engines of Great Falls and Billings are diluted by these maps and that will reduce the Congressional support the rural part of our State needs to remain economically viable and to solve the unique problems they have. CP10 also has a few more people in the Western district. Reviewing historical maps, that was one of the big problems of equity with the last time Montana had two districts as the Western district, which contains the fastest growing communities then and now, had reduced equal representation because of the population disparity.

CP12 may have equal population now, but the Western District is likely to gain more population than the Eastern District and that will create the same problem. Plus recent statewide election results show that both districts, because of the Republican gerrymandering would not be competitive. And by separating Butte from it closely allied Jefferson County and

Gallatin from its economically linked Park County, important communities of interest are not allowed to work with their Congressional Representative for their common good.

As a young woman, I used to argue with my good Republican father about labor unions and while he, as a small businessman, did not favor unions in his shop, he could understand why they were needed when dealing with large corporations because, as a small businessman, he had been subject to the kind of tyranny that such immortal and unaccountable entities exercise over those they control. I favor keeping the union communities whole and part of the Western District.

And why is Pondera County split as it is? No explanation has been forthcoming from Mr. Essman or Mr. Stusek. Small counties need to remain whole so they can focus their political power at the national level.

I also want to point out that it is the Republicans who are gerrymandering in their proposed maps, especially the ones they are bringing forward today. Since I am a resident of the part of the state which has been gerrymandered to be Republican, I believe I have every right to speak on this issue. The Eastern part of the State is designed by both parties' maps to be non-competitive, so why does it matter to me? In a fair and equal redistricting process, both Congressional Districts would be competitive. But at any time Montana had two Congressional Representatives, Eastern Montana has been represented by a Republican. Apparently, that is the historic precedent that this commission wishes to honor, but that is gerrymandering.

Gerrymandering can only be done by a political party in power who wields its influence to predetermine the outcome of an election. And despite the fact that the redistricting commission is charged with not favoring one party or the other, the current political reality of Montana is that the Eastern part of the State is more likely to vote Republican.
