Thank you for the opportunity to comment. As a Montana resident, especially one residing now (Missoula) and previously (Columbia Falls) in the "western" district, and as an enrolled Tribal member, I am IN FAVOR OF MAP CP-12

While not perfect, this map splits fewer counties and keeps Flathead County in the "western" representative district. It ALSO has CKST and Blackfeet in <u>one district</u> where their voices will have greater impact than previous options. This is important for Tribal issues including water compacts.

The other alternative, Map CP 11 is unacceptable because it splits Montana's interests, in particular Flathead County as well as leaving only ONE tribal entity while congregating the other 7 tribes into Eastern Montana. Blackfeet's interests are more in common with CKST's interests than with far-eastern Montana tribes.

Map CP13 is unacceptable because it splits counties and appears to 'bend' and 'reach' into eastern Montana interests - both at the northern border and then again at the southern Montana borders, especially linking the Yellowstone ecosystem's interests to the northern Rockies/Glacier park's interests, which are more "western focused" while Yellowstone looks down the Missouri and east.

I urge the Commissioners to think of ALL Montana and choose map 12 which, of these options, is the BETTER choice to reflect the unique cultural/resource-based flavor of an "eastern" and "western" Montana district, which will allow elected representatives to BETTER represent constituents' interests.

#### Dear Commissioners:

I think that there are the four remaining proposals - I must rely upon unofficial sources since the commission website doesn't say. Second-hand information discourages informed public participation in democratic decisionmaking, as does adding late proposals, too late for most people to even know of them before the comment deadline and today's hearing. Of course, instilling confusion and frustration may cause an I'm-just-it's-over response in the end. That is not what the state needs. I therefore comment on what I think are the four proposals still under consideration.

I favor #11. Why? Because:

#10 splits the Bozeman vote, Bozeman population, and Bozeman economically and social ties with Livingston. Such an attack on any population center is not acceptable!

#11 has Indigenous peoples and their concerns in both districts, keeps the labor axis of Butte–Helena connected, keeps the mountain resort communities together (common interests and common environmental concerns), keeps the economically and socially linked Bozeman–Livingston together, splits no major population center. #11 holds people who identify with the Mountain West together, albeit the Front ranges going with the plains to the east, but counties include both Front ranges and plains so that makes sense. Lewis and Clark clearly identifies more with the Mountain West than the Plains East so this placement makes sense, plus it keeps the city of Helena in the district of its commuting workers. Flathead is split into three - it's hard tell why other than too strict population divide between East and West districts, but I read that Whitefish stays in the West with the Big Sky resort so that is appropriate.

#12 severes the labor vote of Butte and Helena and severes the economically and socially tied Livingston and Bozeman. Severing two Democratic voting centers and no Republican centers does not appear fair nor in the public interest. Two reservations in the West strengthens the Indigenous influence in that district and balances Indigenous issues across the two districts, but a single reservation in any district should be adequate for Indigenous issues to be taken very seriously! Pondera County is split in order to keep the reservation whole, probably the best reason to split a county, although still unfortunate. Given low population of most counties, it seems that counties in general could be kept intact. The population split need not be mathematically precise to within a few votes. Divisiveness should not be a goal or explicit and anticipated outcome; in other words, competitiveness need not mean divisiveness. I would like to believe that both major parties want what's best for the state and nation, and minor parties seem to have no place in the considerations of the commission. Based on the previous maps in this vein, this looks like another attempt to weaken the Bozeman/Gallatin vote by hanging the county out on a limb and cutting off the commuters and businesses of Livingston. Severing the Gallatin County/population aroused such ire that not cutting off less is proposed as if inflicting less pain is an acceptable alternative to inflicting pain: It's not. The late introduction of this proposal reinforces suspicion that this is not offered in a sense of fairness or in the interests of the state. Changing the decision schedule at the last minute also raises a red flag. What's going on behind doors? In other words, the process has tainted this proposal beyond what outlines I can see.

#13 splits Pondera, Lewis and Clark, and Gallatin Counties, including the greater Bozeman population center. Totally unacceptable.

Thank you once again for the ability to comment on the latest congressional maps. As I understand it, the choices are now down to CP11 per the Democrat wishes and CP12 per the Republican wishes. I also think based on the Chair's comments that other maps of compromise could be brought and all maps can be commented on. Since it appears the main decision will be between Maps CP11 and CP12, I wish to offer comments on them. First off, I still don't know how political data can be used which clearly breaks the law per MCA 5-1-115 but the process has been driven there. The Commission has heard from several people on both sides about not splitting their counties, but any realistic view of splitting the population equally while meeting the other mandatory criteria necessitates splitting something. I believe CP12 has the least impact on communities of interest being split and in fact only splits Pondera along lines that are meant to keep all of the Blackfeet Reservation together. CP11 guts the heart of Flathead County and makes no sense other than to achieve a political outcome. No one can honestly say there are any reasons that meet any other criteria or goals. It also goes against the spirit of the Voters Rights Act which only places one reservation in the West. The Chair has always indicated a desire for compromise and consensus. I wish to put forward numbers obtained by Dave's Redistricting on each of the 13 maps. A lot has already been said on how Dave's certainly doesn't look at all races and the numbers can certainly be argued several ways with different races and data, and that there are other ways of determining competitiveness and compactness, I believe that the following numbers show the general trend of the different maps.

This chart shows the Republicans first 4 maps ranged in compactness from 57-95 with an average of 78 and competitiveness from 33-37 with an average of 34. The Democrats first 5 maps ranged in compactness from 8-53 with an average of 33 and competitiveness from 58-66 with an average of 63. If you then look at the republican compromise maps, CP10 dropped in compactness from the 78 average to 60 on CP10 and 58 on CP12 in exchange for increasing competitiveness from an average of 34 to 16 points more in CP10 to 52 and 24 points more in CP12. The Democrats took their average on compactness from 33 to 33 (no change) in CP11 and to 20 in CP13 which they have now rejected. They also changed their average competitiveness of 63 to going further away from compromise to a 67 on each CP11 and CP13. Out side was then soundly criticized by Commissioner Miller about not compromising. I am learning completely opposite definitions of words I used to think I knew, but to say, using the Democrats sacred criteria of only competitiveness, using their sacred Dave's Redistricting, and showing that they have *moved away* from the Republicans by 4 points on Competitiveness while keeping a very substandard compact number, while the Republicans have moved **their** competitiveness score 24 points toward the Democrats and somehow Republicans haven't compromised leaves me questioning any definition of compromise, gerrymander, fair, or many others they put forward. I think it is also interesting that the democrat map CP8 has a competitive score of 58, which is the exact same as map CP12.

As pointed out at the last meeting. CP12 District 1 would have resulted in Ryan Zinke beating Denise Juneau in 2016, Rob Quist beating Greg Gianforte in 2017, Kathleen Williams beating Greg Gianforte in 2018 and Matt Rosendale beating Kathleen Williams in 2020. That shows a very competitive map for the US Representative Seat which is what is being drawn.

This is my first comment submission. I look at the 13 maps on the commission's site to-date, and see politics in almost all of them and flat out gerrymandering in many. These splits are difficult, so the commission MUST try to stick to objective and legal criteria, in this order: US constitution and law, MT constitution, MT law. There is some debate as to the commission operating independently of MT law, but there is no reason to ignore duly passed laws if they do not conflict with our constitution or federal law. The commission should avoid splitting counties, but I think it more important to not split "metro" areas. Splitting Flathead county, as isolated as it is from eastern MT, is ludicrous. Gallatin county and areas around Bozeman are the biggest challenge, as that area ties to both western "tourist" and eastern agricultural tendencies. It is also rapidly growing. As for competitiveness, that is interesting, but the pendulum of politics swings back and forth, and these districts will be with us for a decade. It makes no sense to favor competition over other factors based on only the most recent political leanings. #### Dear Montana Redistricting Commission,

Since the Commission decided yesterday, October 30, to continue deliberations, I am submitting this revision of my previous comments. I believe there was some confusion due to the last-minute submission of new compromise maps from both Republican and Democratic members of the Commission.

First, I will reiterate my thanks to all of you for your service and your citizenship, and for this opportunity to submit comments.

I have been a resident of Lake County and the Flathead Indian Reservation for 38 years. I served as a governor-appointed member of the Flathead Basin Commission for 3 terms, 12 years, from 2005 to 2017, including several years as chair.

I am writing to urge you to support redistricting map 13. I believe it is the fairest of the options still under consideration and would best ensure proper representation of Montanans in Congress.

Many of the comments from participants in the hearing yesterday stressed the need of the Commission to follow the law in making your decision, but some were not acknowledging that part of the difficulty you face is that the laws call on you to draw the lines in consideration of a number of factors which can pull you in different directions.

There was little mention of one of the most important of those laws, even though it is noted on the website of the Montana Districting and Apportionment Commission: 42 USC 1973, which states that no district, plan, or proposal for a plan is acceptable if it affords members of a racial or language minority group "less opportunity than other members of the electorate to participate in the political process and to elect representatives of their choice." In addition, as your website also notes, the Commission must consider "communities of interest."

In Montana, the "racial or language minority groups" of primary concern, acknowledged in our state Constitution, are our Indigenous citizens and communities. They are also groups that have historically been underrepresented. In the political process that non-Indians imposed upon Indigenous communities, they have been harmed more often than given voice over the past 132 years.

When we are drawing lines in regard to these provisions and mandates as they affect Indigenous people in Montana, it is therefore appropriate that we give careful consideration to the comments from representatives of those communities.

The sole Indigenous testimony, to my knowledge, at the October 30 hearing was from Shelly Fyant, Chairwoman of the Tribal Council of the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes. Due to time limits she was not able to complete her testimony, which would have clarified, as is stated in her full written testimony, that her preference is for map 13. (I will note here that while I am submitting my comments as a private citizen, I work as a historian and geographer for the CSKT.)

Ms. Fyant noted in particular that both of the districts should include at least two Tribal nations, something that is accomplished by map 13, which includes both the Blackfeet and Flathead Reservations.

It is worth noting that the CSKT and Blackfeet not only work closely together on many issues, but have also been intermarried for many years, with many families now closely related. This was recently shown in powerful ways when our state mourned the passing of Blackfeet Chief Earl Old Person. One of his great-grandsons is Vance Homegun, who is an enrolled member of the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes, one of the ablest young learners of the endangered Salish language, and a teacher at the Nkwusm Salish Immersion school in Arlee. When Chief Old Person's body was transported from the funeral home in St. Ignatius to Browning for the funeral services, many members of the CSKT showed their respect for the Blackfeet leader by standing in silent tribute along Highway 93 as the hearse — led by law enforcement vehicles of both the CSKT and Blackfeet — passed through St. Ignatius, Ronan, Pablo, and Polson. In a sense, the people of the CSKT were showing the same respect that Mr. Old Person had shown to the Salish community five years before, when renowned elder Louie Adams passed away and Mr. Old Person drove to Arlee to deliver a stirring eulogy in the jam-packed community center.

All of which reinforces our understanding that the Flathead and Blackfeet reservations indeed constitute a "community of interest," and that both should be included in the western congressional district.

Map 13 also satisfies the two main concerns raised by many Flathead County residents at the hearing: that Flathead County not be split or attached to eastern Montana, and that the laws are followed.

As former chair of the Flathead Basin Commission, I would also note that map 13 has geographic coherence, as is also called for in Montana law, by encompassing the totality of the Flathead drainage system within Montana.

In fairness, we should all note that many aspects of our political and cultural geography straddle the Continental Divide, and this poses special challenges for the Commission. Every one of the maps has certain unfortunate lines in this respect, including map 13; as the testimony of many residents of Helena noted, their affinity is far more with Butte-Anaconda-Deer Lodge that with places to the east.

However, the same is true of Glacier County. It encompasses the east side of Glacier National Park, which for 111 years has defined and protected the "Crown of the Continent," a world-renowned symbol of how both the environmental and cultural identity of this part of the world span the Divide. Indeed, during my time on the Flathead Basin Commission, we expended considerable resources in working with the Blackfeet Nation to protect the Flathead Basin through the establishment in Browning of a check station for aquatic invasive species — a check station that guarded the eastern gate to the Flathead system.

For all these reasons, it is clear that map 13 makes sense, and is the best and fairest of the available options.

Thanks in advance for your consideration of my comments, and again for your dedicated service to Montana.

Map 12: I oppose Map 12. In positioning the two fastest growing counties, Flathead and Gallatin, intact, on the western district, this map unduly favors the Republican party in both districts as referenced by the winners in both proposed districts in the last eight-ten state elections. Map 12 separates the common interests, daily communication, transportation, and economic endeavors of Gallatin County from those of Park County. Map 12 separates communities of interest of Butte from Jefferson County and Helena from those with common interests including union workers in Butte, Anaconda, and Deer Lodge. Although only one county, Pondera, is split, the west part of this agricultural county, is separated from other counties in the Golden Triangle, thus diluting the rural, agricultural voice. Overall, rural voters throughout the state will have little influence in either district than map 11 since the largest cities make up most of the population in both districts of map 12.

Map 11: I favor Map 11 since it adheres to all mandatory criteria and meets the additional goal of a district that does not unduly favor a political party. This map places in Gallatin County and Park County in the same district which share travel, transportation, economic, and communication interests. Maintaining Bozeman and Missoula in the same district is logical in terms of their shared interest and commonalities of their university populations and innovative research and business sectors. The shared interests of Butte and Helena would be well represented together in the western district. Although map 11 splits Flathead County into eastern and western districts, no cities are split. The community of Whitefish shares common interests of tourism and recreation with other tourism-influenced economies communities in the western district. Map 11 keeps Pondera County in the eastern district along with the other agricultural counties of the Golden Triangle intact and elevates the rural and agricultural interests of the eastern part of the state. Tribal influence is recognized in both eastern and western districts. Overall, map 11 is the better choice regarding mandatory criteria and the additional goals.

Map 13: Although Map 13 meets some of the criteria well, it fails due to its split of Gallatin County, including a line drawn through the northern part of Bozeman. It does not recognize county lines in Gallatin County, city limits in Bozeman, or communities of interest in Gallatin County. These separations are counter to the mandatory consideration of functional compactness in terms of travel and transportation, communication, and geography. Belgrade and Bozeman have economic, communication, travel and other interests in common. Having lived in Gallatin Gateway and now in Bozeman, I know that multiple daily interactions occur throughout these areas. The population increases occurring throughout the county will only increase these interactions and dilute their voice if assigned to different districts. I favor Map 11 over this map.

Map 10: This map does not appear to comply with the mandatory criteria for compactness since Gallatin County is split between the two districts in several locations, including Bozeman, Gallatin Gateway, and Big Sky. These separations are counter to the mandatory consideration of functional compactness in terms of travel and transportation, communication, and geography. Having lived in Gallatin Gateway and now in Bozeman, I know that multiple daily interactions occur throughout these areas. The population increases occurring in the county will only broaden these interactions and an irregular line dividing the two districts would be extremely confusing to voters. Although Gallatin County and Park County share travel, transportation, and communication interests, map 10 separates the core business areas of Bozeman and Livingston into two different districts. Also, this map separates Pondera County from the other agricultural interest of the Golden Triangle which limits the voice common to these constituents.

Dear Madam Chair and Members of the Commission,

Thank you for your considerable efforts in drawing the new boundary for the Montana Congressional districts.

I wonder what a truly wise, independent, impartial observer would see and suggest for this process.

It is a matter of sound judgement to periodically pause from the rush towards deadlines, to step back, to zoom out, to tune out the noise.

Unfortunately, it is all too easy to miss the bigger picture and get lost in details. Often clever, yet disingenuous, arguments are brought forward to distract and confuse. Bases are rallied. One could easily lose direction in the fog of partisan battle.

We need clear minds, and good hearts. We need to return to True North principles.

The "Criteria and Goals for Congressional Districts" on the <u>official website</u> help to provide such needed touchstones.

Please hold them firmly in mind as something much more than just a set of bullet points. They are grounded, common sense principles providing essential direction.

The above document, adopted by the Commission in July 2021, includes both Mandatory Criteria and Goals. Both sets of principles are important.

The Mandatory Criteria of equal populations, the protection of minority voting rights, compactness, and contiguousness are necessary, but they are certainly not sufficient. Unfortunately, but predictably, there are efforts to divert attention towards or away from certain Goals based on underlying partisan preferences and the desire to surreptitiously gain advantage.

We must remember to include the wisdom embedded in all of them.

In addition to the Mandatory Criteria, the new map also needs to address each of the Goals, ones that most citizens would agree are worthy: That districts are not to be drawn to unduly favor a political party. They minimize the division of cities, towns, counties, and federal reservations. They keep communities of interest intact. They consider competitiveness.

Of those several necessary Goals, I would like to underscore the value of competitiveness.

Gerrymandering for political advantage has certainly been around for a very long time.

Its ills are well known.

Non-competitive districts are known to promote primary selection for more extreme voices. Politicians pick their voters, rather than voters picking their politicians. Many people are disenfranchised, the impact of their votes diluted.

Non-competitive districts severely disincentivize elected politicians from listening to the other side in the formulation of policies that affect all of their constituents.

Non-competitive districts contribute to deepening the polarization that is tearing our states and our great nation apart.

Competitiveness is indeed an essential value that must be preserved.

If the Commission were to ultimately choose a map that met the other Criteria and Goals, but did not also include true competitiveness, I'm afraid to say that its efforts would fall far short of what Montanans deserve.

Please hold the big picture in mind and consider wisely.

I am writing to comment on proposed Maps CP 10, 11, 12 & 13 and one more which I previously proposed which doesn't seem to have been considered by you.

CP 10: This map should be rejected because it splits Gallatin County in an egregious fashion, throws all of Lewis and Clark and Park Counties to the Eastern district thereby severely damaging their mutual communities of interest with Gallatin and other counties (e.g., Silver Bow and Missoula) to the west, unneccessfully keeps Flathead County whole and in doing so, creates to two uncompetitive districts in the state;

CP 11: This map is acceptable but could be improved. Its only significant failing is that it does not include any of the Blackfeet Reservation thereby limiting District 1 to only one Native American community and putting the six remaining reservations and nine tribes all in District 2. Importantly, this map creates a very competitive district (No. 1) and only splits one county, Flathead, and in doing so makes the split in a very logical fashion by putting Whitefish in the west.

CP 12: This map should also be rejected because it splits Gallatin County in an egregious fashion, throws all of Lewis and Clark and Park Counties to the Eastern district thereby severely damaging their mutual communities of interest with Gallatin and other counties (e.g., Silver Bow and Missoula) to the west, unneccesarilly keeps Flathead County whole and in doing so, creates to two uncompetitive districts in the state;

CP 13: This map is marginally acceptable. Its only strong point is that it does include the Blackfeet Reservation thereby increasing District 1's Native American community to two reservations and creating an important community of interest with the CSKT Reservation. While this map creates a competitive district (No. 1), it splits three counties, Gallatin, Lewis and Clark and Pondera, and in doing so makes those splits unacceptable to a great number of people living in those in those counties.

To me, it seems that the desire to keep counties intack is driven by the concept of preserving historic cultural and heritage patterns. The placement of 3 counties in the eastern district vs the splitting of one county that is already culturally split seems to violate this desire. Jefferson, Broadwater, Lewis and Clark counties have economies, history and cultures more identifiable to western Montana than to the eastern portion of the state. Map 11 seems to be superior to map 12 on these points. The splitting of a county with small population might look ok unless you live in a county with small population. I'm sure the committee members know the pride and loyalty of rural county citizens.

The placement of an equal, or as close as possible to equal, number of Native American Reservations in each district seems to be superior in map 12 than map 11. But if I heard the testimony correctly in the last committee meeting, the tribes prefer map 11, so perhaps they know more about how many Reservations should be in each district. Therefore the choice of maps is such that the people directly affected is different than the stated goal of the committee.

Both maps are drawn on the requirement of equal distribution of people as much as possible. Neither of them have been drawn so that the growth patterns of the state are allowed. But I see no requirement that the date certain for population equality be the date when the maps are submitted for consideration. I think that the commission should be allowed to provide a final map that will be applicable for most of the decade it is used. During the discussions of the maps by all committee members, they are all aware of the complexity that the population growth inequality brings to their deliberations.

And finally, the use of a broad brush use of color to display the maps make map 12 more desirable than 11. But the details make the choice much more complex than adoption by computer graphics.
