Respectfully – Map 12 is a mistake. It creates +10 and +30 R favored districts from a previously +13 R average margin of victory in 2020. IN FACT from the past 10 years only the 2018 election cycle (when the R candidate was arrested for assault) had a R margin of victory that was less than the +10 created in the western district from map 12. In other words – map 12 unduly favors the GOP and creates 2 districts that are solidly republican.

Authoritarianism are on the rise in Montana (increasing control by the state, restrictive legislation, etc). Public Comment for November 9 Montana Redistricting Commission Meeting From: Nancy Leifer, on behalf of the League of Women Voters of Montana

The League of Women Voters of Montana supports a map for Montana's Congressional Districts that meets the following goals:

- 1. Competitiveness. The League presented data analysis from 538.com that found the western district in Map 12 to have a 10% partisan lien in favor of the majority party. The League prefers a western district that is more competitive.
- 2. Native American community of interest. The Tribes presented comment that stated their first concern is to have a competitive western district. Their second concern is to have two reservations in the western district, if that can be accommodated while maintaining a competitive district. We are not aware of support from Native Americans for Map 12, and it was clearly opposed by some in the hearing on November 4.

The League supported Map 13 because it was more competitive and had two reservations in the western district. Map 11 was our second choice because it too was more competitive. Competitiveness fosters more voter participation in elections, encourages legislators to listen carefully to the needs of their constituents, and ultimately strengthens our democratic society. We regret that our preferred maps were not chosen but recognize that the process was fair and transparent.

It is difficult to compare data from different sources, as the type of measure and the data sources do not match. 538.com uses precinct level election data for elections from 2012 through 2020. Other data sources cited vary in their competitive rankings, but 538.com., Cook PVI and Dave's Redistricting all ranked Maps 11 and 13 as more competitive than Map 12. The League encourages the Commission to take into account analysis from multiple data sources in assessing the competitiveness of the western district and in assessing legislative districts in the future.

It is not possible to have a perfect map. The distribution of Montana's population makes it impossible to achieve a perfect balance of the criteria and goals the Commission adopted. The League of Women Voters commends the Commission on the openness, graciousness, and transparency of the process and for their hard work and commitment to the people of Montana.

It's our hope that both districts can renew voter enthusiasm and bring higher participation in Montana's electoral process. After all, democracy is not a Spectator Sport! With final adoption of the Map, let the prospective candidates for these seats make it their business to reach out to our citizens for their support.

That job was one of the honors of life, and I served eight years in the Army. I knew in my heart that Montana had long eclipsed the one million resident mark and it would be the first state ever to reclaim a Congressional voice lost decades beforehand. It took agonizing days, weeks, months and years of organizing, but we turned out Montana to get counted. It was a success not just of census staff, but amazing and tireless groups throughout the state who partnered with this federal effort to ensure every Montana got what they deserved -- not just an additional voice in Congress but also the money and power communities across the state will need to rebuild from this two years of pandemic awfulness and the immense growth happening across the state.

Now it is on you all to ensure that district fairly represents a changing and growing state. You have to do this with disparate groups and political parties trying to pull you all in different directions. I have seen the various maps that came out in the last month and more and I wanted to see where you all would end up. A simple equality of numbers does not equate to equality of representation, and I believe Map 12 is a lesser alternative to Map 11 and will stifle rather than foster competition, and thereby suppress rather than enhance political discussion in Montana and Washington.

It's unfortunate that the deadline looms and that a more extended and open discussion among the voters rather than the politicians was not possible.




