Please consider this email as voicing strong support for proposed redistricting maps #11 and/or #13. These proposed maps are the most fair and competitive of the four choices being currently considered. These maps keep with the Redistricting Commissions goals of not unduly favoring one political party over the other and establishing Congressional Districts that are competitive. Maps #10 and #12 DO NOT meet the aforementioned goals. Both maps #10 and #12 are biased and unfair, with Map #12 being the most egregious. My reasons for strongly opposing map #12 are as follows:

- 1. Map #12 creates a district where Republicans have won over 75% of statewide elections over the last 8 years in one district and 100% of elections over the last 8 yars in the other district. That is simply UNFAIR and NOT COMPETITIVE! Intentionally drawing both districts to heavily favor the Republican Party plainly violates the Commission's goal of not unduly favoring one political party over the other.
- 2. Republicans won every single statewide election in both of these districts on Map #12. There were 8 statewide races in 2020 and Republicans won all of them in both districts. This is clearly not meeting even a basic definition of competitiveness that the Commission adopted as a goal.
- 3. Map #12 separates Butte from Jefferson County. People commute from Jefferson County into Butte every single day, and it makes no sense at all to separate the two communities.
- 4. Map #12 also slices off Park County from Gallatin County. Livingston is a vital part of the greater Gallatin County regional economy, and their interests will be greatly diminished or ignored in this proposed version of District 2.
- 5. Map #12 splits a small rural county, ensuring that its voters will be pretty much ignored by both Congresspersons. County splits should respect communities of like interest and larger counties have distinct communities of interest within them that can be split more logically (if at all), so that real representation can be ensured for the communities divided within a county.
- 6. This plan intentionally splits the union vote in District 2 in Montana to separate workers who have joined together for more equitable workplace standards. Separating Helena union workers from their brothers and sisters in Butte, Anaconda, and Deer Lodge is again BLATANTLY UNFAIR and is simply BAD POLICY.
- 7. Map # 12 ensures that rural voices can never carry the day in either of the two Congressional Districts. Montana's largest urban areas are split between the two districts, meaning that rural Montanans can never elect a Congress person of their choice.

Thank you in advance for taking my comments into consideration. Again, I strongly support either maps #s 11 and 13 and strongly oppose maps #s 10 and 12. The overall objective and goal should be fairness and competitiveness, since the revised Congressional District maps will be in effect for the next 10 years!

Chairwoman Smith and Commissioners Essman, Lamson, Miller, and Stusek:

Xest skwekwst. Good morning.

As you work together to generate a final congressional district map, please try to find a way to keep Butte and Helena both in the west.

I want to thank you all so very much for your diligence and hard work. I remember being curious in the early 1970s as to why the state would need to form a constitutional convention in Helena. But over the years I have been so impressed with the product of that effort, our 1972 state constitution, and all it has done to support a healthy environment and promote excellence and social justice in our public schools. Witnessing the creation and implementation of a nonpartisan districting and apportionment commission now joins the list.

But please keep Butte and Helena together. Over the past several years, I have come to see Kalispell, Whitefish, Columbia Falls, and Big Fork as even more of a disintegrating community than the disparate communities there were in my youth when I spent summers in the Flathead Valley playing Legion baseball and recreating at the many lakes across the area. I have now chosen to avoid supporting businesses in Flathead County because Flathead County seems such a very unhealthy place with an ugly anti-community climate. However, I also realize that dividing the Flathead Valley in the districting process would draw lawsuits, and would be difficult to defend, given the geography.

On the other hand, I have seen how the communities of Bozeman and Livingston have grown closer and more community-minded over the years. Around fifteen years ago, I realized Bozeman was much like the Missoula of my youth. But Bozeman has continued to move far past that similarity and down its own path.

Helena and Butte, however—these two communities have a long history together that goes back to territorial days, and that relationship is still strong today. So many people with whom I have worked at OPI and in other state agencies, have family and history in both communities. I would hate to see that bond and that history not respected, honored, and supported.

If there is any way you can find to include the greater part of Helena with Silverbow County, I think the state and the nation would benefit. There are so many stresses tearing apart the social and community fabric of this state and this nation right now, and I would love to see the commission take a stand to respect and honor "community" by working to keep Butte and Helena joined in the districting process. There has to be a way to do this. Please work together to make it so.

I was born, raised, and educated in Missoula.

I have resided in southern Lake County on the Flathead Indian Reservation for the past 40 years.

I am a staunch long-time Independent voter, and it is issues and candidates that matter to me.

My concern here is the representation of both individuals and communities-of-interest in the chosen map.

To me, <u>CP 11</u> does the best job of doing this for both District 1 and District 2. CP 12 does not.

While CP 11 is certainly not perfect, CP 11 is therefore my choice.

One thing I have not heard adequately addressed by anyone over the past month

is the substantial number of indigenous American Indian voters in urban areas of Montana.

I grew up, attended school with, and played sports with many American Indian students in Missoula

and only much later learned that they and their families were tribal members.

So including at least one tribal nation in each district ensures an advocate body to help lift

those voices too,

in Billings, Great Falls, Missoula, Bozeman, and Helena—in both District 1 and District 2.

I am writing to share my input about Proposal 12 recently proposed as the final redistricting map from the Commission.

Proposal 12 would split Pondera County, move Lewis and Clark County from the west district where it has been historically to the east, split the Native American representation between the two districts which would reduce their influence, and would create two districts which would not be competitive. I oppose Proposal 12 as currently designed for these reasons.

I want to offer the following suggestions to improve Proposal 12 and make it more consistent with the stated objectives of the Commission. First move all of Pondera County, now split between the west and east districts, to the east district. While that would divide a small portion of the Blackfeet Reservation from the rest of the Reservation, it would keep Pondera County whole. Second move Powell County from the west district to the east district, since it shares social, economic, and cultural values with Lewis and Clark County and the counties to the east. Third move Park County from the east district to the west district, since it shares social, economic, and cultural values with Gallatin County and the counties to the west.

The revised Proposal 12 with these changes would not split any counties. This proposal would include most of two Native American reservations in the west district and the remaining reservations in the east district. This proposal would create a reasonably competitive western district, rather than two districts which would be dominated by Republicans and would never be competitive.

These maps will be the basis for our political representation for the next decade and it's important that the maps fairly reflect our communities. Thank you for taking the time to read my public comment.

The Commission's tentative final plan does not meet the goals the Commission set for itself.

My name is Erik Iverson and I am a fifth-generation Montanan who resides and works out of Missoula. I am submitting this testimony today in an effort to add to the Commission's discourse on what constitutes a "competitive district" in recent Montana elections.

A brief background on myself: I was born in Great Falls, grew up in the Sweetgrass Hills, attended grade school in Whitlash and Chester, High School in Polson and graduated from Montana State University. After receiving my law degree from the University of Oregon, I moved to D.C. briefly to work for Montana's Congressman at the time, before moving back to Big Sky Country to serve as chair of the Montana Republican Party and work on political campaigns across our state.

Today, I am a professional pollster and President & Managing Partner of Moore Information Group. Over the past five years alone, our firm has conducted over 120,000 polling survey interviews in the state, as well as dozens of focus groups. And if I've learned anything from my research, it's this: Montana is already a highly competitive place to run for federal office.

My main takeaways for this Commission are the following: An R+5 district would be highly competitive with either party standing a very real chance of winning the seat in any given election. Over reliance on national-level congressional ratings such as the Cook Partisan Voting Index and others leads to an inaccurate analysis of the true partisan makeup of proposed Montana congressional districts. Cook PVI relies solely upon presidential election results to determine the partisan lean of a district. By that logic, no Democrat in nearly 60 years could have won statewide office as Montana has not given a majority of its vote to a Democratic presidential candidate since Lyndon Johnson.

In fact, Montana leads the nation in ticket splitting when presidential races appear on the same ballot as U.S. Senate races, having voted for a Democratic U.S. Senate nominee and Republican Presidential nominee 10 out of the past 19 times. Since our state has one of the highest incidences of ticket splitting in the nation – something Montanans are rightfully proud of – it stands to reason that the Cook PVI methodology would be more inaccurate when applied to Montana than it would be in any other state.

When gauging partisanship in Montana, it is best to make an apples-to-apples comparison and look at proposed congressional districts in terms of how previous congressional candidates would have fared in each of the proposed districts. This new line, after all, only applies to U.S. House races. Using this methodology, the four maps under consideration by this commission – CPs 10, 11, 12, and 13 – would all be considered highly competitive and capable of being won by either major party in any given election.

Furthermore, using county-level population growth estimates included in the 2020 census, it is clear that whichever map the commission ultimately comes to a final agreement on, the western congressional district is set to grow at a much faster pace than the eastern district. Models vary, but current estimates indicate that the population deviation could be as high as 6-8% between districts in the next handful of years. In layman's terms, that's the equivalent of adding an extra Helena or Butte to one side of the congressional line.

To be sure, as a professional pollster, highly competitive elections are good for business. And I am confident the polling business will continue to flourish in western Montana if any of these four highly competitive maps are adopted.
