#### Honorable Commissioners:

I have reviewed the final two maps presented to the public for redistricting Montana an dam asking that the Commission support Map #11. Map #11 closely follows the historical precedent of Montana's 2 Congressional districts in the 1980's and achieves virtual perfect parity in population equality.

Additionally Map#11 provides a number of additional important and compelling strengths that underscore the purpose and spirit of fairness in redistricting. For example, it does far better than Map #10 in keeping communities of interest intact. Helena remains with Jefferson County -- keeping the two communities integrated as they are economically and culturally. Similarly, Bozeman maintains its multiple commuter connections and economic ties with the adjacent communities of Belgrade, Gallatin Gateway and Livingston. Furthermore it keeps the Rocky Mountain Front, Golden Triangle and parts of the Hi Line intact, maintaining an integrated rural, agricultural presence and profile for the district.

Importantly this map also provides for a modestly competitive Congressional District as opposed to the two solidly Republican, entrenched and partisan-slanted districts offered by Map #10. This is especially important for keeping a fair exchange of ideas and thoughts among district citizens and additionally moderating the views and decisions of the future elected Representative - of whatever party, who must answer to and fairly represent the diverse views of the electorate.

For these and other reasons, I hope the Commission unanimously adopts Map #11 as the clearly more fair alternative for balanced and open Montanna over the next decade.





Comments from the League of Women Voters of Montana Montana Districting and Apportionment Meeting October 30 Presented by Rosanne Nash, League of Women Voters Montana Board Member

Throughout the process of districting for Montana's two Congressional seats, the League of Women Voters of Montana urged this Commission to center its decision about where to draw the line on one concept: what will most effectively and fairly represent and engage voters for the next ten years. The League is a non-partisan organization that has stood on the side of Republicans in Maryland and Democrats in Pennsylvania to push for maps that are fair to voters, not politicians.

The League has the following comments on Maps 10 and 11:

Map 10 honors the concerns of the Native American community to have at least two reservations in each district. To achieve this, Map 10 splits Gallatin County. Data analysis from 538.com indicates that Map 10 has two Republican dominate districts, one with a margin of 28% and the other with a margin of 11%.

Map 11 does not honor the concerns of the Native American community to have at least two reservations in each district. Map 11 splits Flathead County. Data analysis from 538.com indicates that the Map 11 creates two Republican dominant districts, one with a margin of 34% and the other with a margin of 7%.

Given a choice between Maps 10 and 11 as they are currently configured, the League supports the more competitive Map 11, though we encourage the Commission to verify that the Tribes are alright with there being only one reservation in one of the districts. However, both maps fail to offer a truly competitive district.

Montana voters will not be as engaged, and Montana's elected representatives will not be responsive to all of their constituents, if both districts are Republican dominate districts.

We ask the Commission to reconsider the configuration of Map 11, looking more carefully at how Flathead County is divided and whether there may be other fine-tuning potential to bring the balance for the western district to a 5% or less advantage for Republicans. This would make the western district truly competitive.

Thank you for this opportunity to comment. The League commends the Commission for its efforts to seek public comment and for working to make Montana's districts fair for Montana voters.
