To the Redistricting Commission,

I appreciate the chance to comment on the two final congressional district maps.

I clearly see CP 11 as the best map for defining our two Montana districts - it is the only map that does not excessively favor one party in both of the districts. With CP 11 we will have one district that falls within the competitive range. CP 11 closely follows the former (1980s) congressional districts, shifting only two counties to reach population equality. CP11 is also supported as the map of choice by Western Native Voice (and other indigenous groups) as the only map that will give Native American voters a voice at the polls.

I ask that the Commission reject CP 10 based on the fact that there are no competitive districts in it. With CP 10, one party is favored heavily in *both* districts, weakening the voices of individual voters, and likely even affecting voter turnout. In addition, CP10 unfortunately splits the towns of Big Sky and Gallatin Gateway in half, violating the criteria to minimize unnecessary divisions of towns. Also, CP 10 would break with precedent by separating Helena and Butte, diluting union strength and separating an important community of interest.

Please allow Montana to have one competitive district, to keep the spirit and health of our politics vibrant. Please choose CP 11.

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

I thank you for the opportunity to comment on the latest versions of the redistricting maps and for your time on this commission.

Of the two new maps, I strongly support CP #11 over CP #10 for the following reasons –

- 1. There has always been a strong economic connection between Livingston and Bozeman with workers flowing between the two communities, as well as commerce. Map #11 respects this connection while Map #10 does not.
- 2. Map #11 keeps Butte and Helena in the same district as it should because these towns have strong union representation and therefore common interests. However, Map #10 attempts to dilute the union voice by separating Butte from Helena in different districts.
- 3. Tribal communities benefit from Map #11 because District #1, which is the only competitive district, has Tribal representation. Therefore, candidates for District #1 will have to depend on Native American votes in order to win and this enhances the power of their voice in the democratic process. A district where the representative is chosen at the primary level (District #2) results in poor representation for any groups that aren't members of the dominant party. This brings me to my next point.
- 4. Map #10 overwhelmingly favors the Republican party for both districts. Therefore, only Republican voices will be heard. A fair map would include a competitive district where the candidates would have to consider the needs of every party and community in order to win. With Map #10, the representatives for both districts would be chosen at the primary level and these representatives would have little inclination to consider the needs of non-party members or diverse voices.
- 5. Map #10 not only breaks up Gallatin County, it splits up the small towns of Big Sky and Gallatin Gateway. There is an obvious gerrymandered hack at the Democrats in Gallatin County.

The CP #11 map does a better job in keeping communities together, mitigates gerrymandering and provides the fairer outcomes and opportunities for diverse voices to be heard.

- Areas that heavily rely on ski tourism to support the local economy are kept in one district, forcing a Congressperson to pay attention to the needs of areas that use the winter outdoor recreation to drive economic growth.

First, thank you for your service. I know yours is difficult work and I, and many, appreciate the hours and care you have put into creating a meaningful and equitable solution to the challenge of making sure every Montanan is well represented in the United States House of Representatives.

While both maps have significant merit, I would encourage adoption of Map 11. By keeping Lewis and Clark and Gallatin Counties intact, Map 11 provides, in my view, two districts with different key issues.
