Regarding the redistricting effort for 2 U.S. Congressional districts due to the gain of an additional Representative for Montana as a result of 2020 Census population counts –

I believe it is imperative that ALL Montanans have the opportunity to be fairly represented in Congress, specifically in BOTH houses of Congress. Unfortunately, this is not currently the case since we only have one Representative for the entire state. I am thrilled that Montana has regained a second seat and will now be sending two individuals to represent our state in Congress.

That being said, my main concern is that those two individuals represent their constituents, who are split between two major political parties. I think it would be extremely unfair and detrimental to the people of Montana for both of those Representatives to be of the same political party since that would mean that around half of the people of this state would not have a representative of their viewpoints and beliefs, taking their concerns and needs into account with their vote in Congress. A representative democracy does NOT mean that the majority party (with between 51 and 60 percent of the vote) would hold 100% of the seats in Congress; because that would mean that 40-49 percent (nearly HALF) of the people of Montana would not have their interests represented. That is a fact, it is common sense, and it would be very wrong.

Secondly, as far as how to split Montana into two Congressional Districts, I believe the state is naturally divided in it's character based on it's geography (eastern Montana's rural plains vs. western Montana's mountainous, timbered areas); so it makes sense to divide the state into an East District and a West District (recognizing that the line between the two district runs more NW to SE than it does directly N to S). I also think that urban/suburban areas have very different interests than rural and remote areas. The difficulty arises in that while the eastern/plains areas are much larger geographically, these areas have a much smaller population overall; so splitting the state into two districts based solely on this geographical divide would result in rather unequal populations for each "half". This is a difficult issue to resolve, and in making two districts with near-equal populations that are compact and contiguous it is inevitable that at least one county will need to be split between the two districts. While that is unfortunate, splitting a county is much less a problem than splitting an urban area would be; and it would at least be reasonable to split one or more counties with their urban/suburban areas in one district and rural areas in the other.

In summary, and based on these issues and concerns which I've stated, my preference for two Congressional Districts would be:

- 1. generally Western MT including Missoula, Helena, Butte, Bozeman, Belgrade, Hamilton, Deer Lodge, Anaconda, Dillon... (and possibly Polson, Kalispell, Whitefish, Livingston depending on population totals) &
- 2. generally Eastern MT including Great Falls, Billings, Laurel, Lewistown, Havre, Shelby, Cut Bank, Miles City, Glasgow, Glendive, Sidney, Hardin..
- * The dividing line between the 2 Districts would run generally from Glacier National Park to Yellowstone National Park, with Helena and Bozeman definitely included in the Western District.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed legislative maps. I live in Bozeman, grew up in Billings, and have lived in several communities across the state. From a community perspective I feel there is a fairly distinct difference depending on which side of the continental divide one is on, but this should not be the most heavily-weighted factor in determining district boundaries. However, some sort of east/west split makes more sense to me than north/south. And, the maps with districts that aren't contiguous make no sense at all and should be eliminated from consideration. The same is true for maps such as #8, where the boundaries seem to selectively include certain counties. Furthermore, I think it is important to keep towns, and counties within the same District (for example, I don't agree with the map that splits Frenchtown from the rest of Missoula county), to keep the populations even between districts, and to ensure that the Districts don't split the Native vote. I also think it is important to account for projected future growth of each district in some way. This can likely be achieved by ensuring Montana's urban areas are evenly divided between the two districts.

Public Comment for October 5, 2021 Montana Districting and Apportionment Commission From Nancy Leifer

On behalf of the League of Women Voters of Montana

The League of Women Voters is a non-partisan, non-profit member organization. In the 2019 Supreme Court decision Rucho v Common Cause and Lamone v Benisek, the League was involved on the side of the plaintiffs in both suits, in one case on the side of the Republicans and in the other on the side of the Democrats. In the area of redistricting, the League supports maps that comply with mandatory criteria, are free of partisan bias, support competitive districts where possible, and recognize concerns of communities of interest.

A report by The American Center for Progress from 2016 noted that "Members of the U.S. House of Representatives are re-elected 97 percent of the time. And in the 2016 election, only 10 percent of the 435 House seats were considered competitive." Elections in which politicians are guaranteed to win reduces responsiveness to constituents, and thereby also reduces accountability.

Montana can improve this situation by creating one Congressional district that is competitive. Political competitiveness requires assessing the political implications of maps. Maps that are not assessed for political impact will have a political impact, nonetheless.

The League favors maps that have assessed the political impact and have created one district that is competitive. If both districts have the same partisan distribution as is true statewide, one party will be precluded from having the opportunity to elect the candidate of their choice because their voters are too thinly spread between the two districts. Concentrating voters of the minority party in one district to achieve an equal balance with the majority party creates a district that is competitive and offers equal opportunity.

Hello Presiding Officer and Commissioners,

I will not be able to participate in the October 5th meeting so I am providing my additional thoughts on the East-West III or PM 238 Map.

- 1. It was based on testimony that wanted the Flathead and Blackfeet Reservations to be in the same district.
- 2. It keeps every county intact with the exception of Pondera which was broken up to ensure the Blackfeet Reservation remained whole. Pondera County is frequently broken up for Montana Legislative races.
- 3. Lewis and Clark County remains in the same district as Jefferson County since they share economic interests. Travel to the west of Helena is more difficult because of McDonald Pass, especially in the winter months. This also provides more diversity for the Eastern District both economically and politically.
- 4. There is no cracking or packing of voters since Kalispell and Bozeman remain in the Western District, and the counties remain whole with the exception of Pondera.
- 5. Park County (Livingston) was put in the Eastern District because of population deviation factors and the difficulty of travel to Bozeman during the winter months. There are gates on I-90 near Livingston because of frequently poor road conditions during the winter. It also allows the Western District to be more compact.
- 6. The 2020 Senate race should be most considered because the former Governor turned out to be the strongest Democratic candidate during the 2020 election. The proposed Western District was under 51% Republican in a +10 GOP election for U.S. Senate. This makes the Western district a naturally competitive district with no cracking or packing needed.
- 7. This map was created with bipartisanship in mind.
- 8. The total deviation is only 0.07% with the reason for the deviation not being 0% is the counties are not broken up, with the exception of Pondera because of the Blackfeet Reservation, to ensure communities of interest remains intact.

Hello Presiding Officer and Commissioners,

This is my third East-West Map (East-West Map III) that has the Blackfeet and Flathead reservations in the West while placing Park County in the East to achieve a low deviation of 0.07%. The justification for the slight deviation from 0% is getting the Blackfeet and Flathead reservations in the same district and the mountain pass between Livingston and Bozeman making travel difficult in the winter months. Park County being placed in the East makes the West District more compact in area as well.

This map allows both Bozeman and Kalispell to remain in the West so the gerrymandering accusations are negated on both sides.
