# **COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES CITIZENS REDISTRICTING COMMISSION (LA County CRC)**

# Task Order for Racially Polarized Voting (RPV) Analysis Consulting Services for Redistricting

June 29, 2021

### LA COUNTY CRC OVERVIEW

The County of Los Angeles Citizens Redistricting Commission (LA County CRC) is charged with drawing the lines for Los Angeles County supervisorial districts (SDs) after the Federal decennial census and in compliance with:

- U.S. Constitution
- Federal Voting Rights Act (VRA) of 1965<sup>1</sup>
- California Election Code<sup>2</sup>

The final map must be delivered by December 15, 2021, and comply with the following requirements:

- 1. Districts shall comply with the U.S. Constitution and each district shall have a reasonably equal population with other districts for the board, except where deviation is required to comply with the VRA or allowable by law.
- 2. Districts shall comply with the VRA.
- 3. Districts shall be geographically contiguous requiring knowledge of Los Angeles County cities and unincorporated areas.
- 4. The geographic integrity of any city, local neighborhood, or local community of interest shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division to the extent possible without violating the requirements of paragraphs (1) to (3), inclusive.

(A community of interest is a contiguous population that shares common social and economic interests that should be included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation. Communities of interest shall not include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.)

5. Districts shall be drawn to encourage geographical compactness such that nearby areas of population are not bypassed for more distant areas of population.

### **OBJECTIVES AND TASKS**

The LA County CRC issues this Task Order to retain Racially Polarized Voting (RPV) consulting services – from either an individual consultant or consulting firm (Proposer).

The selected Racially Polarized Voting (RPV) Consultant will work directly with:

- LA County CRC's Ad Hoc Working Group Demography, which is advisory. Decisions are made by the full LA County CRC
- ARCBridge, which is providing demography and mapping consulting services for the LA County CRC, using the ESRI software
- David Ely of Compass Demographics who is building the datasets, including voter precinct data and surname matches, for Los Angeles County (see Attachment)
- LA County CRC staff as needed (see Attachment)

The tasks to be performed entail:

# Task 1. Conduct preparatory analyses to help the CRC determine whether RPV exists in Los Angeles County and, if so, among which races/ethnicities, including:

- Assess whether and to what extent precinct-level prior-election voting results correlate with voters' race/ethnicity and potentially with multi-racial/multi-ethnic coalitions (Data from surname matching will be available.)
- Present analyses, including assessment of strength and persistence of polarized voting, to the LA County CRC on or before October 15, 2021

# Task 2. Critique LA County CRC's proposed map options and final recommended map for each of the five supervisorial districts from a racially polarized voting perspective

- Analyze 2 to 5 draft maps made public by CRC in October-November 2021
- Analyze draft recommended CRC redistricting map in November-December 2021
- If issues are identified in the draft recommended CRC redistricting map, provide guidance on how to address concerns before the LA County CRC issues its final recommended redistricting map

# Task 3 (Optional): Analyze voter cohesion based on other factors

The Proposer should let us know the possibility for analyzing whether and where there is voter cohesion, based on language, national origin, or other characteristics available in datasets provided by the County of Los Angeles for 2019. If possible, please estimate the cost separately from the other two tasks.

The Proposer should describe <u>methods and timeline</u> to be used to conduct these analyses for at least Task 1 and Task 2.

The LA County CRC would like to retain the RPV consulting services by the end of July 2021.

### LETTER PROPOSAL FORMAT

Please prepare a Letter Proposal that contains:

- Name and contact information of the individual who can enter into contractual agreement for this project
- Objectives and tasks to be performed
- Timeline
- Proposers' unique capabilities, including biography of proposed consultant(s)
- Descriptions of 1 to 3 RPV projects performed, focusing on the analytical skills and statistical analyses
- 3 References
  - Contact name, title, email, and phone number
  - Organization affiliation and brief description of work performed
- Estimated hours, hourly rates, and total costs for at least Task 1 and Task 2
  - Note: This is fixed fee. The Proposer shall bear any cost incurred to complete this project in excess of the maximum not-to-exceed costs.
- Compliance with Ethics Requirement (listed next)

The Proposer should: a) provide all of its own equipment such as, but not limited to, computing and telephonic equipment and b) set own schedule to complete the tasks and deliverables by the assigned deadlines.



# CALIFORNIA ELECTIONS CODE ETHICS REQUIREMENT<sup>3</sup>

The LA County CRC may not retain any consultants to advise the Commission or Commissioners regarding redistricting if, within the last 10 years, they or any of their immediate family members (i.e., a spouse, child, in-laws, parents, or siblings) have:

- Been appointed to, elected to, or have been a candidate for office at the local, California, or Federal level representing the County of Los Angeles, including as a member of the Board of Supervisors
- Served as an employee of, or paid consultant for, an elected representative at the local, California, or Federal level representing the County of Los Angeles
- Served as an employee of, or paid consultant for, a candidate for office at the local, California, or Federal level representing the County of Los Angeles
- Served as an officer, employee, or paid consultant of a political party or as an appointed member of a political party central committee
- Been a registered California or local lobbyist

The above requirement also applies to any team members or subcontractors that the Proposer proposes. Please provide assurances that your proposed team meets these requirements.

The Proposer retains the ability to provide contract services for other entities but shall not engage in any conflict of interest relating to the specific requirements for the LA County CRC redistricting process. The Proposer should not undertake any other contract work that might conflict with the ability to meet the LA County CRC's deadlines.
