


Montana University System Historical Funding



Total sources of the Montana University System (MUS) current unrestricted revenues has grown from \$125.5 million in FY 1988 to \$499.2 million in FY 2018. During that time, the composition of revenue has shifted, as shown in the chart above. Initially, state support including general fund and six mill levy, comprised the majority of all revenue sources at 74.0% of the total. State support now comprises 37.5% of all revenue sources.

Tuition (including scholarships and waivers) has the most significant change. Tuition revenue is influenced by enrollment trends and increases to tuition rates. Enrollment and tuition include both resident and non-resident students. The enrollment in FY 1992 was 26,526 full-time equivalent students with non-resident students accounting for 17.5%. Compared to FY 2018, the MUS had 34,983 full-time equivalent students with 27.8% of total enrollment from non-resident students. In 1992, tuition revenues comprised 23.1% of all current unrestricted revenue sources, today it comprises 60.5%.
