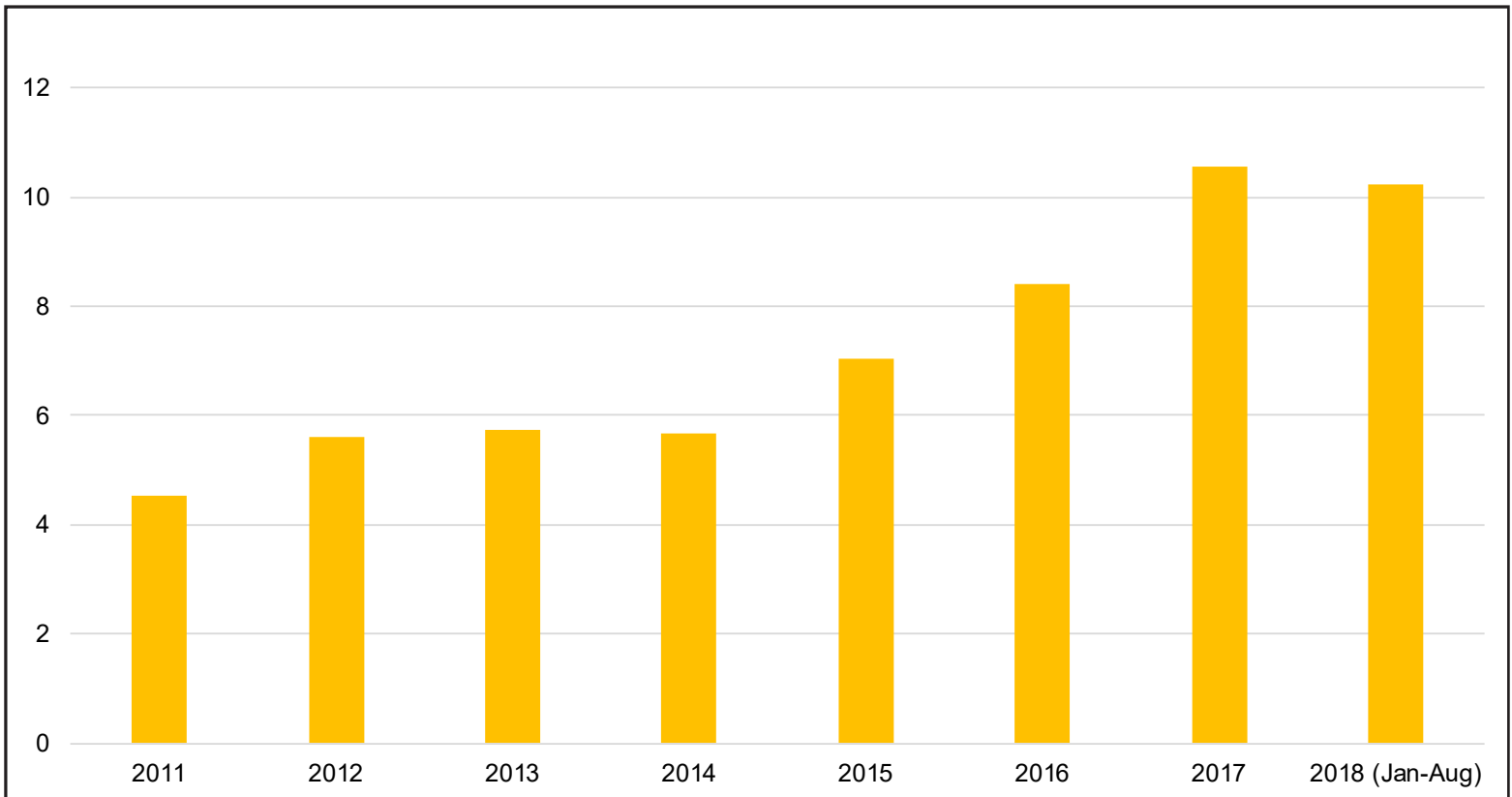


Child Protective Services - Average Removal Rate per 1,000 Children by Year



The chart above shows the rate at which children who are victims of maltreatment are removed from the home for the 2010-2018 period. Children who are removed from the home are placed into foster care or an alternative. Montana's removal rate is elevated compared to other states.
