
Commissioner of Political Practice has \$902,161 in total authority, \$867,195 (96%) is HB 2 authority

The Commissioner of Political Practice (COPP) has expended 73% of its HB 2 budget in FY 2020. HB 2 authority accounts for 96% of the agency's total authority; the remaining 4% of authority is a one-time-only (OTO) appropriation from HB 715 for an update to the campaign finance database to meet the requirements of SB 363, as well as FY 2019 carryforward authority for personal services.

In HB 2, COPP was appropriated \$99,785 (OTO) in personal services for legal counsel in FY 2020, 85.6% of the appropriation has been expended. In addition, COPP has expended \$914 in personal services for Covid-19 leave.

Operating expenses are 58.0% expended. Budgeted expenditures for State Information Technology Services of \$181,176 are 34.3% expended, driving the lower expenditures for operating expenses. COPP anticipates expending additional funding for application development services before the end of the fiscal year.
