Figure one shows the percentage of non-resident anglers and which state they came from. Anglers totaling 234,100 came from all fifty states and the District of Columbia. Not shown are Alaska (0.4%), Hawaii (0.2%), Vermont (0.2%), and the District of Columbia (0.2%)

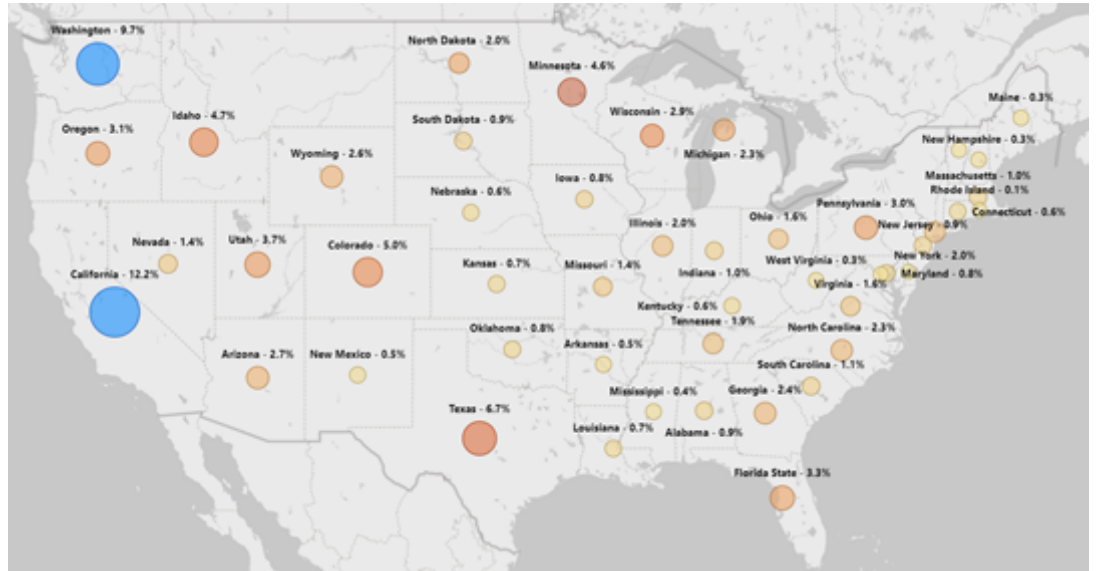
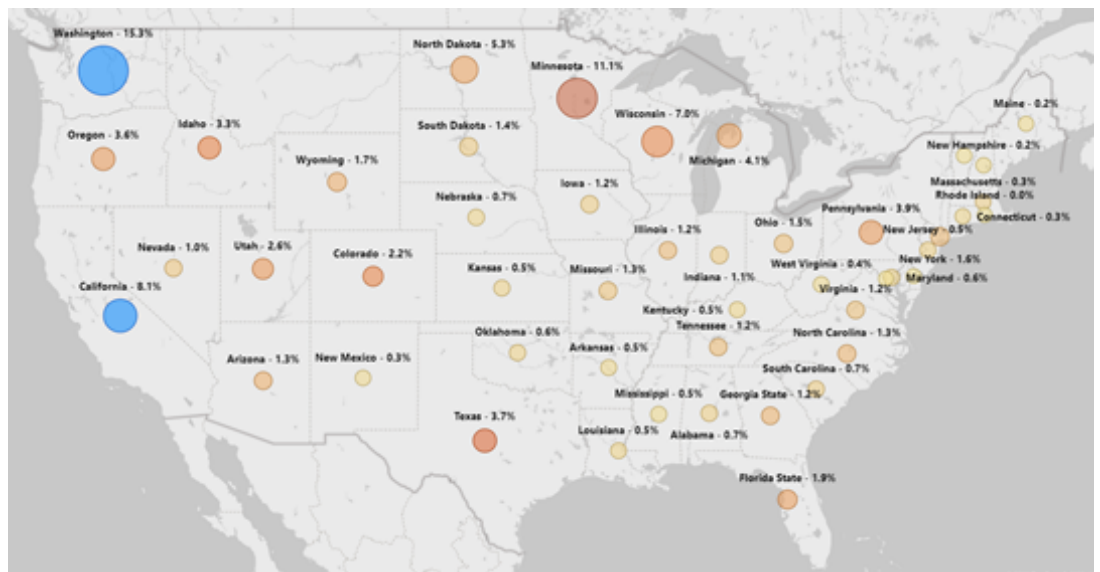


Figure 2: Non-Resident Hunters

Figure two shows the percentage of non-resident hunters and which state they came from. Hunters totaled 83,975 and came from all fifty states and the District of Columbia. Not shown are Alaska (0.9%), Hawaii (0.1%), and Vermont (0.2%).



Visitors from every state in the U.S. came to Montana to hunt and fish in FY 2022. Anglers and hunters from California, Washington, Minnesota, and Texas accounted for about one third of those out-of-state visits and the neighboring states of Idaho, Wyoming and the Dakotas accounted for 10.6%.

¹ In addition to the annual licenses, anglers must also purchase a conservation license and aquatic invasive species pass.
