MONTANA COAL ENDOWMENT REGIONAL WATER PROGRAM

PROGRAM SUMMARY

The 1999 Legislature created the treasure state endowment regional water system fund as a sub-trust within the coal tax permanent trust. The Montana Coal Endowment Regional Water Program (MCEPRW), established in 90-6-715, MCA, was created to provide a state match for the receipt of federal and local funds for the four large regional water projects in the state. The program is administered by the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC). Interest from the trust can be distributed as a match to federal and local funds to the regional water authorities that have met certain conditions including:

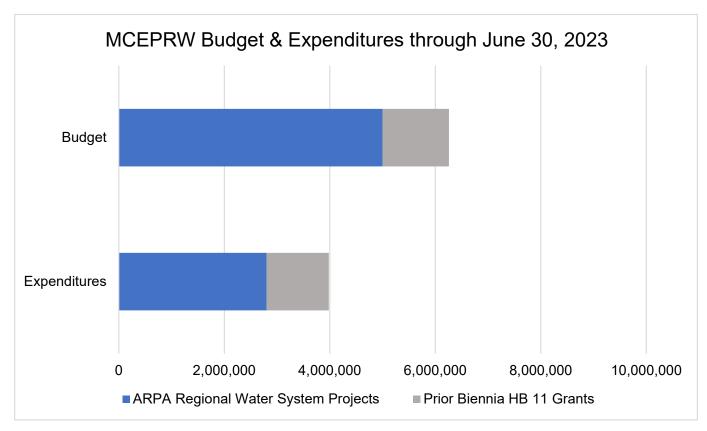
- An executed agreement with DNRC
- A DNRC approved management plan
- A financial accounting system that conforms to generally accepted accounting principles
- A detailed preliminary engineering report

The interest from the trust is also used to pay administrative costs to the DNRC and the four regional water authorities:

- Dry Prairie Regional Water Authority (federally authorized)
- North Central Montana Regional Water Authority (federally authorized)
- Dry-Redwater Regional Water Authority
- Musselshell-Judith (Central) Regional Water Authority (federally authorized)

BUDGET & EXPENDITURE

The following chart and table show MCEPRW FY 2023 budget and expenditure through June 30, 2023 (fiscal year-end 2023).

Originally appropriated under HB 11, a budget of \$5.0 million was established in the 2023 biennium for state regional water system projects. Rather than being funded with dedicated state special revenue, the appropriation was funded by federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds authorized under HB 632. In FY 2023, \$2.8 million of that authority was expended.

For prior biennia projects under the MCEPRW program, approximately \$1.3 million of remaining authority for projects was budgeted at the beginning of FY 2023. The regional water system project expenditures totaled \$1.2 million.

FUND BALANCE

The following chart shows the projected MCEPRW fund balance, based on 2023 biennium actuals and 2025 biennium projections.

Revenue in FY 2023 was approximately \$311,000 higher than HJ 2 (2021) projections. The fund is a sub-trust within the coal tax permanent trust; revenue for the fund is interest earnings from the trust. In FY 2023, expenditures for administrative costs for both DNRC and the regional water authorities, appropriated under HB 2, totaled \$890,000, and expenditures for prior biennia project grants totaled \$1.2 million. The resulting ending fund balance at the end of FY 2023 totals \$5.9 million.

For the 2025 biennium, revenue is based on HJ 2 (2023) projections and totals \$7.5 million for the biennium. For project grants, the 68th Legislature appropriated \$10.0 million under HB 11. Additionally, \$2.5 million was appropriated under HB 2 for the 2025 biennium for DNRC and regional water authority administrative costs. The 2025 biennium ending fund balance is projected to approximately \$918,000.
