Individuals with disabilities have specifically been negatively impacted by the pandemic as pandemic-related layoffs have disproportionately impacted the disability community. From March to April 2020, the number of employed working-age people with disabilities fell by 20 percent (950,000 people), while the number of employed

This program will augment current counseling staff by temporarily adding 10 qualified full-time Rehabilitation staff. This will allow the VR program to invite approximately 1,000 additional individuals with disabilities in for services that intend to lead to employment over the next biennium.
