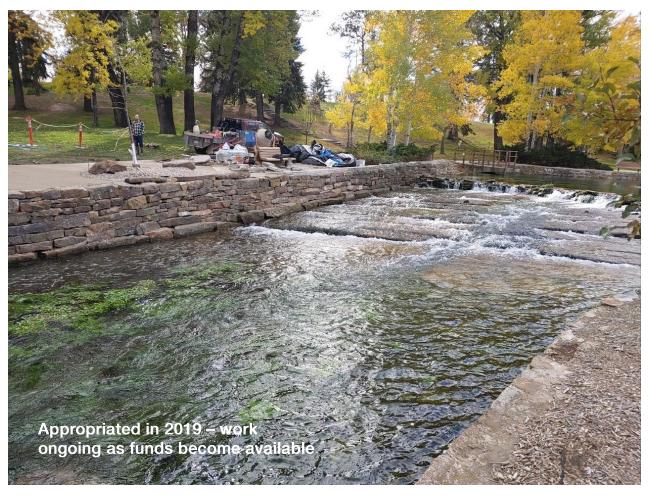

#### Design status of Low-Side Housing:

Patterned after DLR Group-designed, Bledsoe Co. TN Corrections facility, completed in 2013.

Based on repeatable 256-bed unit.

Preliminary estimates developed by Sletten Construction.

Evaluation of modular construction for cells continue.

#### **Project Milestone:**

First bid package of the Bundle on the street.

Planning for MSP is concurrent and informed by population studies and projections by this commission.

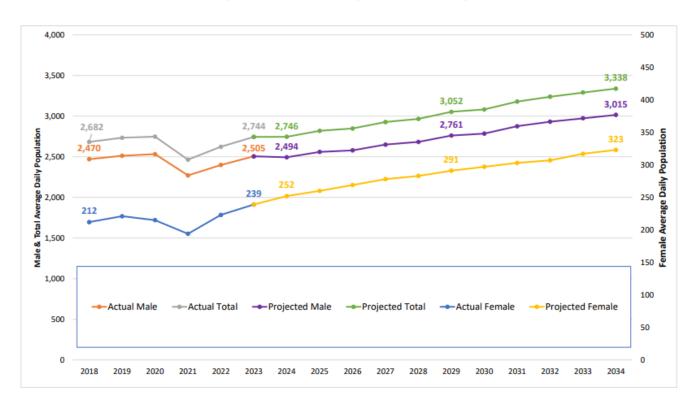

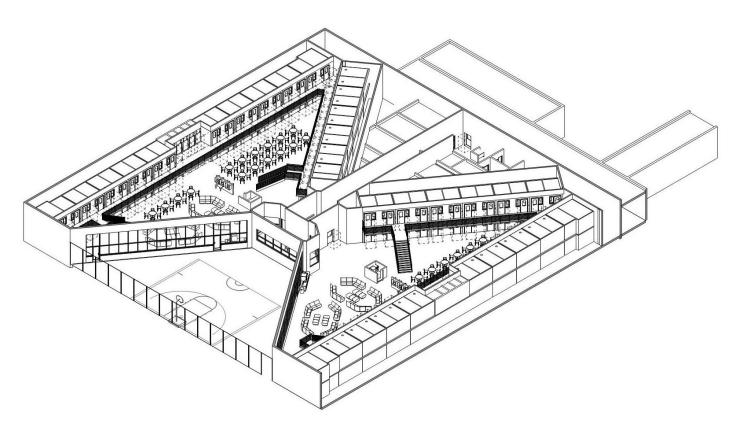

# Update on HB 872: Behavioral Health System for Future Generations

#### **Reporting Timelines:**

Consultant-led subcommittee work on behalf of the Commission & DPHHS is nearly complete. HB 872 requires the Commission to submit its recommendations to the Office of Budget & Planning by July 1, 2024.

#### Capital Projects out HB 872:

\$55M appropriated to DOA for Capital Projects after administrative rules have been adopted and after the Commission transmits its summary report to the Governor.

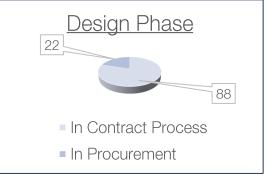

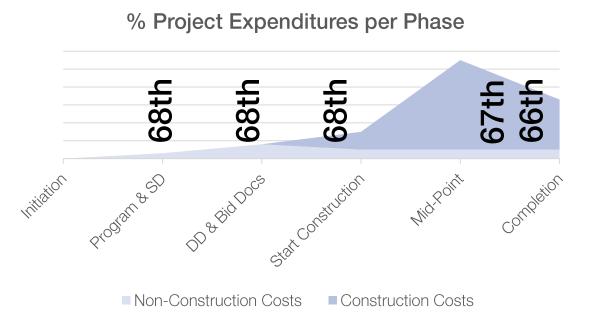


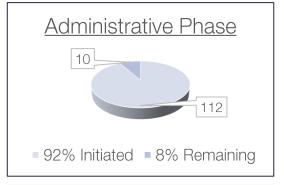
### **HB 190, Performance Metrics\***

Continue to request information that would help you better understand a Major Repair Project or Capital Development.

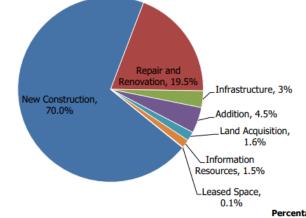

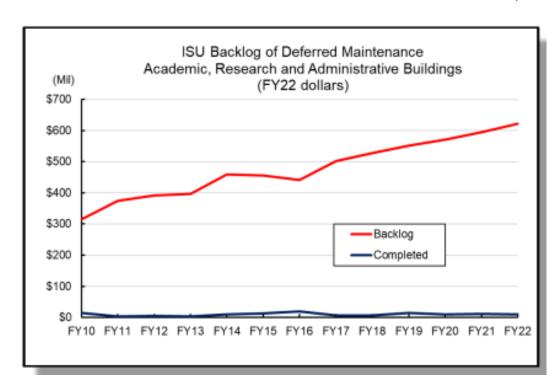

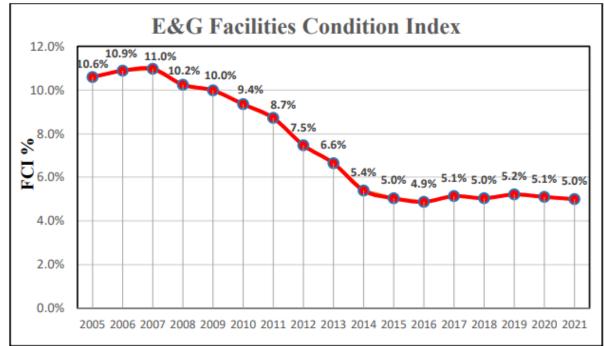
State of Colorado Agency Report – Historical Gross Square Footage

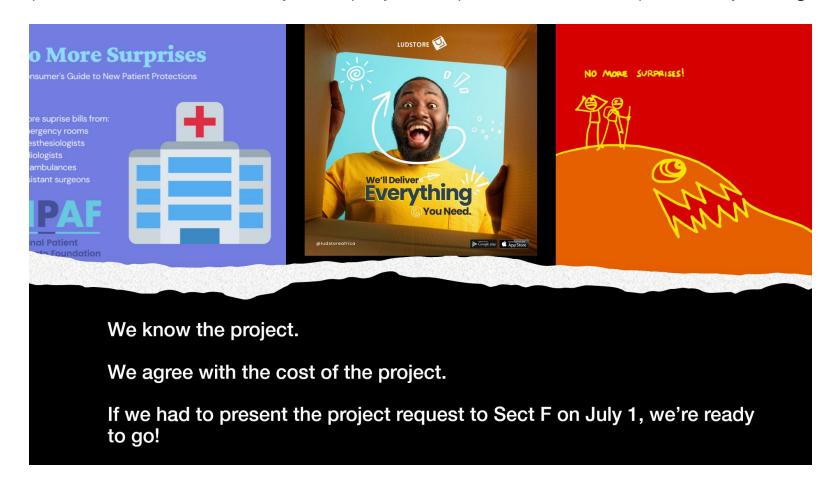

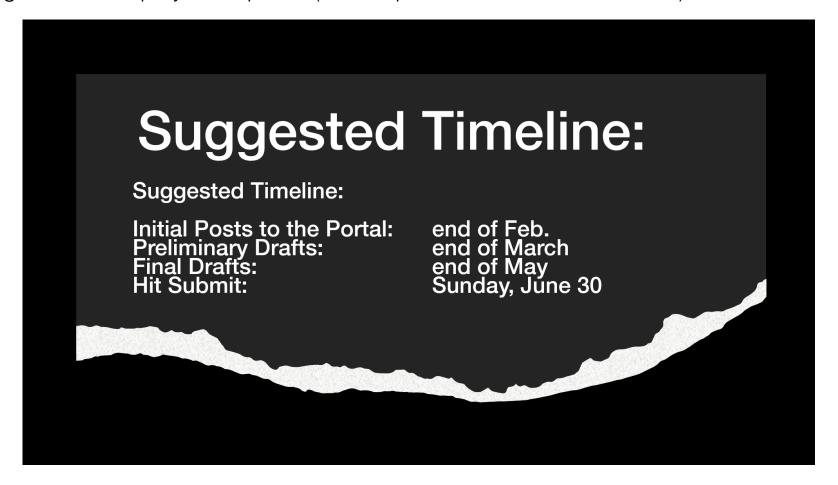

- Chemical Stores: Outdated panel

- Upgrade the Bosch system, which calls into dispatch for the fire alarms























### 69th Session Prep:

- See your project request from the legislator's perspective.
- Share your world with them.
- Be creative and thoughtful to tell your story.
- Use photos to your advantage.
- Reference previous studies if available.
- Include essential metrics to support the request.
- Learn from each other. Study other agency's requests.
- If the request is not funded, can you wait another \_\_\_ years?



#### Improvements considered by A&E for each project request:

Add a quick summary statement (see example below). Include Agency priority, e.g. 6<sup>th</sup> of 10, in addition to the State's overall priority, e.g. MR-34 Reference any existing feasibility studies or master plans that are relevant to the request. Ideas for "estimated costs".

- » Updates lab space for nursing, health science, radiology, and cosmetology

### For the 69th Session: "an estimated cost"

#### **Minnesota**

The Governor recommends \$457,000 to renovate the MDA potato inspection facility located in East Grand Forks. This building is used primarily for potato-related services, including Seed Potato Certification, laboratory testing for pathogens, potato cyst nematode surveys, USDA shipping point inspections, federal crop insurance grading, and sampling.
