




- LRBP this session is <u>4X larger</u> than any previous HB 5 (typical is ~\$250M)
- Rollout Plan:
 - o Reduces A/E procurement activities from 134 to 40
 - o Provides for quicker project implementations in aggregate (i.e. as bundled)
 - o Slightly elevates risks to scope completeness and quality
 - o Increases cost for added resources to accomplish speed



Anchor Indicators – Design Perspective



- In September's Update "The next 2 months (SEPT OCT) are critical to the LRBP project rollout approach."
- **MORE FOUND EFFICIENCIES** released several bundled projects in one Request for Qualifications (RFQ)
- **40 MONTANA FIRMS** submitted 128 responses to a multi-bundle RFQ (33 major repair projects for \$63.3M) in early October.
- **25 MONTANA FIRMS** submitted 65 responses to a multi-bundle RFQ (16 projects for \$217.9M) in mid-November (5 out-of-state firms submitted 6 responses).
- 5 firms were **FIRST-TIME** responders to projects issued by the Department.
 - "In the past few years, most of our work has been in the private sector. We
- realized that we **NEEDED A BETTER BALANCE BETWEEN PRIVATE AND PUBLIC** projects as private owners are more nervous about higher interest rates."

Anchor Indicators – Construction Perspective



- "Available people resources remain a challenge, so the solution is **MORE TIME**, not more money."
- Bid Response: have bid 18 Design-Bid-Build projects successfully since the first of June, averaging 1 project bid/week, over \$95.5M, 32 total bidders, still **LESS THAN 2 BIDDERS/PROJECT**
- **1 FAILED BID** out of 18, rebid was successful.
- **GEOGRAPHICALLY DIVERSE** project locations include Miles City, Billings, Bozeman, Dillon, Helena and Columbia Falls.
- Observations:
 - 1. We see more bidders for projects nearest the population centers.
 - 2. Bids are few but **COMPETITIVE AND NEAR ESTIMATE**
 - 3. Different general contractors are proposing same subcontractors.

Anchor Indicators – Administrative Perspective



- The whole is greater than the sum of its parts.
 - 1 Administrator (also manages projects)
 - 1 Design Section Manager (also manages projects)
 - 1 Construction Section Manager (also manages projects)
 - 1 Accounting Manager
 - 1 Planning Manager (also manages projects)
 - 6 Project Managers
 - 1 Retirement
 - Recruiting 2 Open Positions; need an accountant
 - 4,000 miles/month

HB 5: What is Next?



- Continue to Execute Contracts with Architects & Engineers
- Leverage A/Engineers Firms for Owner-Rep Services to help administer projects
- More RFQ'S to Release
 - December 2023 RFQ 4 @ ~\$20M
 - March 2024 RFQ 18 @ ~\$98M




Market Trends in Context: Labor





Market Trends in Context: Overall Costs






Market Trends in Context: Backlog




Backlog = the amount of work, measured in months, that construction companies are contracted to do in the future.

The more backlog, the more positive the outlook for the construction industry.

"The AIA/Deltek Architecture Billing Index, often viewed as a 9-12 month forward-looking indicator of construction activity, dipped into negative territory in September, with AIA Chief Economist Kermit Baker noting the decrease in billings shows a hesitancy among clients to commit to new projects."



A&E OBSERVATIONS

- 1. % OF EXPENDITURES ON CAPITAL PROJECTS IS NOT AN EFFECTIVE METRIC
- 2. THE NEXT 6-9 MONTHS ARE CRITICAL TO THE EXECUTION OF PROJECTS (addressing backlog, fees, contracts).
- 3. 2 YEARS AGO, THE SOLUTION TO SUPPLY-CHAIN CHALLENGES WAS MORE \$\$\$, TODAY THE SOLUTION IS **NEED MORE TIME**.



Goal: **100% No Surprises** on July 1, 2024.

A&E Division will **take full advantage** of the phrase in MCA 17-7-202 (1) "**Before July 1** of the year preceding a legislative session, ..."



Be Proactive: LRBP Portal is open and available for Agency submissions. **Communication** between Division & Agency can start now, and is.





Importance of Visualization: use photos to show existing conditions.

Quality of the Estimated Cost: align budget with scope

69th Session: LRBP Planning + Beyond



Supporting Investigations for Project Requests: master plans, feasibility studies, & academic facility plans

Longer-Range Thinking: the development of 6-year plans.



A Strategy for Deferred Maintenance: facility condition assessments **not as required reporting** but as a necessary tool.

Current Replacement Values: **deeper dive** into CRV.
