(1) The department of commerce is authorized to make up to \$5 million in grants to nonprofit corporations as defined in [section 14(2)] for emergency shelter, as defined in [section 14(1)], property acquisition, construction, shelter space acquisition, or general capital improvement projects. The grants authorized in this section are subject to the conditions set forth in [section 18].

- (2) The department of commerce shall receive proposals from nonprofit corporations for emergency shelter facility infrastructure projects.
- (3) Funding for projects may be provided only as long as there are sufficient funds available from the amount that was deposited or transferred into the emergency shelter facility infrastructure account for grants established in [section 15(1)]. Funding for these projects must be made available in the order that the grant recipients satisfy the conditions described in [section 18].

NEW SECTION. Section 17. Eligibility -- submission deadline -- priority -- rulemaking authority.

(1) A nonprofit corporation as defined in [section 14(2)] may apply to the department of commerce for emergency shelter facility infrastructure grants under [section 16].

- (2) Nonprofit corporations shall submit grant applications to the department in order to be eligible for funding under [section 16].
  - (3) The department is authorized to adopt rules or guidelines necessary to implement [section 14]
