23	(2) "Capital development" means capital projects provided for in 17-7-201(2).
24	(3) "Capital project" means the planning, design, renovation, construction, alteration, replacement,
25	furnishing, repair, improvement, site, utility, or land acquisition project provided for in [sections 1 through 10].
26	(4) "LRBP capital development" means the long-range building program capital developments
27	account in the capital projects fund type provided for in 17-7-209.
28	(5) "LRBP major repair" or "LRBP MR" means the long-range building program major repair

- (c) The Montana university system shall prepare the proposed final plan documents and submit them in their entirety to the legislative fiscal analyst. The documents must be provided in a digital format and shall be distributed by the legislative fiscal analyst to the members of the three committees identified in (3)(a)(i) through (3)(a)(iii) electronically.
- (d) Within 90 days of the legislative fiscal analyst receiving the proposed final plan documents, the legislative finance committee must organize and hold a joint meeting of the three committees where the Montana university system shall make a presentation of the final plan documents to the members of those committees.
- (e) Within 10 business days of the Montana university system's presentation to the three committees, each committee will submit comments on the plan, if any, to the department and to the board of regents.
- (f) Prior to the adoption of a plan, the board of regents shall consider legislative and public comments. The board of regents shall notify the legislative fiscal analyst in writing of the final selection of a facility to provide statewide educational resources.
