11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation for Montana historic grant program. (1) There is		
14	appropriated to the department of commerce \$8,501,314 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, from the		
15	historic preservation grant program account established in 22-3-1307 to finance projects authorized in		
16	subsection (2).

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Contract Deadline.

Except as provided in subsections (1) and (2), a grantee must enter into a definitive, binding contract with a qualified contractor to construct the project before September 30 of the even numbered year preceding the next regularly scheduled legislature. If the grantee fails to meet the deadline, the grant is cancelled, and the



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1 funds revert to the historic preservation grant program account established in 22-3-1307 for use in the next 2 biennium. 3 (1) A grantee who fails to meet the statutory deadline because the project was damaged by fire or 4 other form of casualty, the grantee may request one, two-year extension during which time, the project must be 5 placed under contract, or the grant will be terminated. 6 A grantee who fails to meet the statutory deadline due to failure to find a qualified contractor to (2) 7 construct the project may request one, two-year extension of the grant. To be granted the extension, the 8 grantee must show that it diligently pursued all reasonable avenues to find a qualified contractor and was 9 unsuccessful. 10 11 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Section 2. Approval of grants -- completion of biennial appropriation. 12 (1) The legislature, pursuant to 22-3-1305, authorizes grants for the projects identified in [section 1(2)]. The authorization of these grants completes a biennial appropriation from the historic 13 (2) 14 preservation grant program account established in 22-3-1307. Grants to entities from prior bienniums are reauthorized for completion of contract work. 15 (3) 16 NEW SECTION. Section 4.Section 3. Condition of grants -- disbursement of funds. (1) The 17 18 disbursement of grant funds for the projects specified in [section 1(2)] is subject to completion of the following 19 conditions: 20 The grant recipient shall document that other matching funds required for the completion of the (a) 21 project are firmly committed. 22 (b) The grant recipient must have a project management plan that is approved by the department 23 of commerce. 24 (c) The grant recipient must be in compliance with the auditing and reporting requirements 25 provided for in 2-7-503 and have established a financial accounting system that the department can reasonably

14	(1) The department of commerce must disburse grant funds on a reimbursement basis as grant recipients incommerce			
15	eligible project expenses.			
16	(2)	If actual project expenses are lower than the projected expense of the project, the department		
17	may, at its disc	cretion, reduce the amount of grant funds provided to grant recipients in proportion to all other		
18	project funding sources.

21	shall send a co	opy of [this act] to each federally recognized tribal government in Montana.
