Dear Chairman Hopkins and members of the Long-Range Planning Committee,

I regret not being able to attend today's hearing on HB 11 in person, and I thank you for the opportunity to tell you about and urge your support for the City of Red Lodge Wastewater Improvements Project, HB 6, and HB 11.

- The City of Red Lodge has requested a \$125,000 Montana Renewable Resource grant and a \$500,000 Montana Coal Endowment Program grant to improve our wastewater collection system.
- The project includes rehabilitating 3,300 lineal feet of sewer mains with cured-in-place pipe and installing a grinder pump upstream of the wet well.
- Much of our collection system is over 100 years old. Infiltration and Inflow (I/I) of groundwater into our system is "excessive."
- During large storm events, wastewater bubbles out of sewer manholes.
- The project is necessary to protect public health and safety. The MCEP and RRGL grants are necessary to keep our user rates affordable for our residents.
- The City is also facing other challenges recovering from last summer's disastrous flood in addition to a upsurge in growth caused by COVID.

Your support of HB 6 and HB 11 will help us hold the line on user rates and develop a project that is needed to protect public health and safety by reducing the potential for exposure to sewage.
